CHANDIGARH: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday extended warm wishes to all Punjabis living across the globe on the sacred occasion of the festival of lights Diwali and Bandi Chhor Diwas. In a message, the Chief Minister said that since centuries, Diwali, the festival of love and prosperity, has been celebrated with utmost devotion and religious zeal. He said that the sparkling lights of Diwali not only illuminate every household but it is also a symbol of the victory of light over darkness, good over evil and hope over despair. thereby cementing the bonds of harmony, amity and goodwill. "May Diwali and Bandi Chhor Diwas bring peace and prosperity besides bountiful bliss to our people," added Mann. Meanwhile, Akal Takht jathedar Giani Raghbir Singh has asked Sikhs to refrain from decorating their houses and other buildings with electrical lights on Bandi Chhor Diwas (November 1), as it falls on the same day as the 40th anniversary of the 1984 anti-Sikh riots. He asked them to go for traditional ghee 'diyas' instead. "On November 1, 1984, Sikhs were massacred mercilessly in 110 cities and towns of the country, including the national capital, under the patronage of the then Congress government," he said in a message.

GST records second-highest collection at Rs 1.87 lakh cr in Oct

NEW DELHI: Gross GST collection in October rose 9 per cent to over Rs 1.87 lakh crore, the second-highest ever, on pick-up in domestic sales and improved compliance. The Central GST collection stood at Rs 33,821 crore, State GST at Rs 41,864 crore, Integrated GST at Rs 99,111 crore and cess at Rs 12,550 crore during the month. As per the government data released on Friday, the total gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue grew 8.9 per cent to Rs 1,87,346 crore. In October 2023, the mop-up was at Rs 1.72 lakh crore. October 2024 recorded the second-best GST mop-up. The highest ever collection was in April 2024 at over Rs 2.1 lakh crore. During the month under review, GST from domestic transactions grew 10.6 per cent to Rs 1.42 lakh crore, while revenues from tax on imports rose about 4 per cent to Rs 45,096 crore.



Refunds worth Rs 19,306 crore were issued during the month, registering 18.2 per cent growth over the year-ago period. After adjusting refunds, net GST collection grew 8 per cent at over Rs 1.68 lakh crore. Deloitte India Partner MS Mani said the buoyancy in GST collections is an account of an excellent combination of festive season sales and increased compliance. "The driver appears to be domestic supplies...While many large states have recorded an increase in GST revenue above 9 per cent, some of them and many of the smaller states have shown a below average increase, which would be an area of concern for those states," Mani said.

Over 7,000 Special Trains Running For Chhath Festival: Ashwini Vaishnav



NEW DELHI: Minister for Railways Ashwini Vaishnav conducted a surprise inspection at New Delhi Railway Station on Friday to review the arrangements to cope with the heavy rush of passengers who are going to different destinations in Bihar and Uttar Pradesh for Chhath Puja. While assessing the preparations and taking stock of other issues facing the travellers during the trip, the Union Minister tried to understand the current situation with officials, also engaging in conversations with several passengers. Ashwini Vaishnav sought first-hand information from the officials as well as the passengers at the New Delhi Railway Station. Talking to IANS, Ashwini Vaishnav said: "This year, preparations are being made in a very organised manner. A total of 7,035 special trains are being operated, compared to 4,500 last year. In addition to that, ticketing arrangements have been made outside the station to allow people to arrive and wait in an orderly manner. Care has been taken to ensure that passengers do not face any difficulties reaching the platform." Elaborating on the preparations further, the Minister explained that the Railway Protection Force (RPF) has been deployed at various locations to maintain control over the situation. The Minister also extended warm wishes for Chhath and Diwali to everyone. In fact, over 7,000 special trains are being run. Many people travelled home using these trains during Diwali, and those planning to travel for Chhath and return after the Puja can also avail of these services. Meanwhile, officials briefed the Union Minister on Indian Railways' robust plan to ensure safe and convenient travel for passengers heading home for the Chhath Puja celebrations. Major routes from Delhi, Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Chennai, and Bengaluru to high-demand destinations like Bihar and Uttar Pradesh are being taken care of. Additional coaches have been added to trains, while stations have enhanced security measures, including CCTV surveillance, which are handling the high volume of travellers. Key stations like New Delhi, Anand Vihar, Ahmedabad, Surat, and Bandra have introduced special arrangements to ensure a smooth experience for passengers.

India Plans Incentives to Accelerate Data Centre Growth with Focus on AI, SMEs



NEW DELHI: In light of increasing adoption of cloud computing, artificial intelligence (AI), and machine learning (ML) technologies, the Indian government is considering a new incentive-based policy aimed at fostering the growth of data centres, according to highly placed sources. The proposed framework will go beyond infrastructure development, focusing instead on computational output and advanced AI capabilities to benefit start-ups, small and medium enterprises (SMEs), and the broader digital economy. Currently, India lacks a specific incentive-linked policy to promote data centre growth. The most recent support came in the Union Budget for FY23, when the Finance Ministry granted infrastructure status to data centres, opening doors for easier access to financing. However, the government is now set to revise the Draft Data Centre Policy, first introduced in November 2020, to align with the rapidly evolving technological landscape. According to sources cited by CNBC-TV18, the government is not keen on offering blanket incentives for merely establishing data centres. Instead, it aims to ensure that benefits are not monopolised by a few large technology or real estate companies. The focus will shift towards linking incentives with the compute power available for key sectors like start-ups and SMEs, supporting their integration into India's expanding AI ecosystem. A major area of emphasis in the updated policy will be AI/ML-driven data centres, which require specialised infrastructure outfitted with high-performance GPUs and TPUs. These facilities, essential for training and deploying AI models, come with high costs and energy demands. The government views these centres as critical to India's AI aspirations, particularly given the surge in multi-lingual data generation across the country. During the India Mobile Congress, Reliance Jio Infocomm Chairman Akash Ambani urged the government to expedite the policy revision. With Prime Minister Narendra Modi in attendance, Ambani stated, "The scale and speed of multi-lingual data generation in India, which will drive the AI revolution, will grow exponentially. We request the government to fast-track incentives for AI/ML data centres to ensure Indian data stays within Indian borders."

AAP slams Centre over 'tardy' purchase of paddy in Punjab

CHANDIGARH: The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Tuesday slammed the BJP-led Central government over the "tardy" purchase and lifting of paddy from Punjab. AAP MP Malvinder Singh Kang said "it is the routine procedure of the Food Supply Ministry, for the FCI (Food Corporation of India) to lift old grains from its warehouses before the arrival of new grains in the mandis (markets) each year, so that there is space available for grain shifting". "This process has been in place for decades, not just for a year or two," he said. Addressing the media along with AAP leaders Jagdeep Singh Kaka Brar and Shaminder Khinda here, Kang said this time the Central

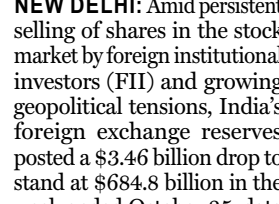


government intentionally did not empty the warehouses to trouble the farmers of Punjab. "Now, as the controversy has escalated and the central government finds itself in a difficult position, it is misleading the people of Punjab through its minister Ravneet Bittu. The BJP has deliberately created this issue." Kang raised questions

regarding BJP leaders, asking why the Chief Minister himself is not going to Delhi to resolve the matter. He questioned whether the BJP "wants the Chief Minister of Punjab to beg the Prime Minister to empty the warehouses. If that is what they want, they should openly state that the Chief Minister will have to plead with the Prime Minister for a resolution". Kang mentioned that since March, Punjab's Food Supply Department has been writing letters to the FCI and the Central ministry, requesting the lifting of grains. "But the Central government was sleeping for nine months," he said. He noted the dates, saying that the Punjab Food Supply Department first wrote to the

FCI on March 5, followed by letters on March 11, 13, 19, and 22. In June, letters were sent on 14 and 27. A letter was also sent on September 3. Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann also spoke to Central Minister Pahlad Joshi on September 25 and met him in Delhi on September 30. The Chief Minister also met with Union Home Minister Amit Shah and Union Minister JP Nadda. Kang challenged the BJP to tell them whom else the Chief Minister should meet. Kang stated that after the meeting with the Chief Minister, Joshi claimed that 2 million metric tonnes would be cleared in October, while a total of 18.5 million metric tons of crops are expected to arrive in the mandis.

India's Forex Kitty at \$684.8 Bn, Gold Reserves Go Up



NEW DELHI: Amid persistent selling of shares in the stock market by foreign institutional investors (FII) and growing geopolitical tensions, India's foreign exchange reserves posted a \$3.46 billion drop to stand at \$684.8 billion in the week ended October 25, data released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) showed on Friday. However, gold reserves, which form part of the foreign exchange kitty, increased by \$1.08 billion to \$68.53 billion during the week, according to the central bank. There has been a surge in gold buying amid geo-political tensions. According to industry experts, gold is now acting as a hedge against US economic sanctions, traditionally being a safe haven asset and a hedge against inflation. Despite inflation being moderated, gold has rallied to new highs. The share of gold in the country's forex reserves has also surged more than 210 per cent since 2018. India's foreign exchange reserves had soared to an all-time high of \$704.885 billion at the end of September taking the country to the 4th position globally after China, Japan, and Switzerland in the size of its forex kitty. The country's forex reserves

have overall gone up by \$38.39 billion in the current financial year which is sufficient to cover imports for 11.2 months based on the balance of payments, according to the RBI. This reflects the strong macroeconomic fundamentals of the economy. Looking ahead, India's forex reserves are projected to grow and the strong forex will boost its economic growth trajectory by strengthening its position internationally, drawing in foreign investments, and promoting domestic trade and industry. The changes in foreign currency assets result from the central bank's actions in the forex market and fluctuations in the value of foreign assets within the reserves. According to experts, the bullion is likely to close this week in positive, amid support from safe demand, ETF buying, uncertain US election outcome, and rising bets for aggressive rate cuts from global central banks.

Jathedar Akal Takht on the occasion of Bandi Chhod Diwas chided Shriomani Akali Dal

Jathedar Akal Takht on the occasion of Bandi Chhod Diwas while delivering a message to Sikh community directly chided the Sikh political outfits for ignoring the Sikh ethics. Jathedar in his message to Sikh community said the present Sikh politics has lost ethi-

cality and such things cannot boost the morale of the young generation, so it is a matter of deep concern. He said the Shriomani Akali Dal party was initially founded with certain religious aims and time has come for them for self-introspection to bring improvement. He said that there was dire need to rekindle the Sikh po-



litical outfits, since now it has gone to its deathbed. He said the presently Sikh political par-

ties were more concerned with their vested interest rather than doing something logically concrete for the wellbeing of Sikh community. He said mass migration of Sikh youths due to lack of employment to foreign lands from Punjab was also a matter of deep concern. The youth living here also became prey to drug addiction, he quipped.

Congress stands badly exposed: PM Modi slams party for unfulfilled poll promises

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday slammed the Congress for "unfulfilled" poll promises and said that the fiscal health of the Congress-ruled states is turning from bad to worse. "The Congress Party is realising the hard way that making unreal promises is easy but implementing them properly is tough or impossible. Campaign after campaign they promise things to the people, which they also know they will never be able to deliver. Now, they stand badly exposed in front of the people!" PM Modi said in a post on X on Friday. He claimed that the developmental trajectory of Congress-ruled states is worse. "Check any state where the Congress has Governments today - Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana - the developmental trajectory and fiscal health is turning from bad to worse. Their so-called Guarantees lie unfulfilled, which is a terrible deceit upon the people of these states. The victims of such politics are the poor, youngsters, farmers and women, who are not only denied the benefits of these promises but also see their existing schemes diluted," PM Modi further said. He said, in Karnataka, Congress is busier in intra-party politics and loot instead of even bothering to deliver on devel-



opment. "Not only that, they are also going to roll back existing schemes. In Himachal Pradesh, salaries of government workers are not paid on time. In Telangana, farmers are waiting for the waiver they were promised. Previously, in Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan, they promised certain allowances which were never implemented for five years. There are numerous such examples of how Congress works," the Prime Minister added. Warning the people of the country, PM Modi said: "The people of the country will have to be vigilant against the Congress-sponsored culture of fake promises! We saw recently how the people of Haryana rejected their lies and preferred a Government that is stable, progress-oriented and action-driven. There is a growing realisation across India that a vote for Congress is a vote for non-governance, poor economics and unparalleled loot.

Income Tax Return Filing Deadline Extended for Select Taxpayers

NEW DELHI : The Income Tax Department has announced an extension of the income tax return (ITR) filing deadline for specific categories of taxpayers for the Financial Year 2023-24 (Assessment Year 2024-25). The new deadline has been pushed from October 31, 2024, to November 15, 2024, providing additional time for



compliance. The extension specifically targets taxpayers who are required to submit their tax

audit reports by September 30, 2024, and were originally mandated to file their ITR by October 31, 2024. This decision was formally communicated through a circular issued by the Ministry of Finance on October 26, 2024. According to the official announcement, the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT)

implemented this extension under Section 119 of the Income-tax Act, 1961. The modification applies to assessee mentioned in clause (a) of Explanation 2 to sub-section (1) of section 139 of the Act, affecting the due date for furnishing Returns of Income under sub-section (1) of section 139 for the Assessment Year 2024-25.

Indian youths, parents should think twice before dreaming to study in abroad

Students dreaming of studying in Canada as well as parents should think twice before making a decision because the present scenario is fast changing and reality is completely opposite to what is seen there. This was revealed by Sanjay Verma while talking to media persons, who was posted there as Indian High Commissioner and has been recently called back by the government. He said, enrolment in substandard colleges in Canada is dangerous for the students, as seen Indian students who wish to study there should think seriously about it, despite spending lakhs of rupees by the parents many

students get admission there in substandard colleges and do not get any job opportunities as a result, they become depressed and are forced to take steps like suicide as usually seen bodies of two students used to arrive from Canada every week during his tenure when at least two bodies of students were sent from Canada to India every week after failing they committed suicide rather than face their parents. Sanjay Verma said that students go there with dreams of a bright future, but many times their bodies come back in body bags. Verma said parents should research the colleges thoroughly before making a decision to send their wards



through unscrupulous agents also responsible for getting Indian students admitted in little-known third degree institutes. Many such colleges hardly conduct one or a couple of classes in a week as such they study only that

much and their skill development remains accordingly. He said that after this it is usually seen that a student with an engineering degree is often seen driving a cab, selling teamosa at a shop, working as a waiter and many times wash-

ing utensils in a restaurant. Therefore, the ground reality there is not very encouraging. The Indian diplomat said that after going to Canada, the students after getting education there and most of their parents had sold their lands and other assets or taken loans from the banks and financiers to fulfill the desire of their children settle abroad become mentally sick and at times attempt committing suicides, since after this the student cannot think of returning, because he has nothing left to return and prefer to commit suicide. Verma said that in the last about 18 months, he got many students to record videos about their problems and upload them on YouTube.

Thousands paid obeisance at Sri Darbar Sahib on occasion of Festival of Lights

Thousands of devotees on the occasion of 'Bandi Chhor Divas' (Diwali) festival of lights here on Friday have paid obeisance in the sanctum sanctorum of Sri Darbar Sahib (Golden Temple), the most visited sacred Sikh shrine.

However, since early morning today, devotees were seen queued up to pay obeisance in the sanctum sanctorum of the Golden Temple and at Akal Takht (Highest Sikh Temporal Seat).

Before paying obeisance in the Harmandir Sahib, most of the devotees preferred holy dip in the 'SAROVAR' water pond of Temple around marbled periphery with belief that that holy dip would wash away their all bad deeds of previous births.

A special arrangement to facilitate the devotees was made by SGPC with the deployment of a heavy task force. LANGAR (Community Kitchen) have made elaborate arrangements of food for more than two lakh devotees who stay in the Golden Temple throughout the night.

According to SGPC, the significance of Bandi Chhor Divas' festival that on the same



day in 1620, sixth Sikh master Guru Hargobind Sahib was released by the Mughal emperor Jahangir from the Gwalior fort along with the 52 other kings.

When Guru Hargobind Sahib was detained in the Gwalior fort at that time Mughal Emperor Jahangir fell sick and his physical condition went deteriorated. Then Jahangir was advised by astrologers to release Sikh master Hargobind Sahib to get rid of his miseries.

After being released, Guru Hargobind Sahib directly reached Golden Temple in

Amritsar, whereupon people lighted earthen lamps with desi ghee. The entire holy city was illuminated with candles and tastefully decorated on the release of Guru.

However, it may be mentioned here that earlier Jathedar Akal Takht in a message released from the Akal Takht has advised the community to avoid electric illumination in Gurdwaras and at home on the occasion of Bandi Chhor Divas. But he asked the community to lighten earthen lamps with Desi Ghee.

Telling the reason to avoid

electric decoration he said that that forty years back on November 1, 1984 there was mass level genocide of the members of the Sikh community in Delhi and 110 other cities of the nation. Sikhs were brutally killed by the turbulent mob which was backed and supported by the then ruling Indian Government. The wounds of that period were still coming unhealed. Now it was a period of four decade and community still remember that horrible time of genocide of community members.

Harjinder Singh Dhami elected SGPC President for fourth consecutive time

Advocate Dhami gets 107 votes while Bibi Jagir Kaur gets 33 votes

Harjinder Singh Dhami (67) was elected as President of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) for the fourth consecutive time today, after the annual election of SGPC office bearers.

Vachhoa, Surjit Singh Tughwal, Paramjit Singh Khalsa, Surjit Singh Garhi, Baldev Singh Kayampur, Daljit Singh Bhinder, Sukhharpreet Singh Rode, Ravinder Singh Khalsa, Jaswant Singh Purain and Paramjit Singh Raipur. Along with this, SGPC member Kulwant Singh Manna was appointed as Honorary Chief Secretary.

Addressing the media after being elected as the President, Harjinder Singh Dhami said that this great service to the Sikh community has been received with the grace of the Guru, which he will try to fulfill under the Guru's fear, humility, and the Panthic sentiments. He said that in this year's election, along with the AAP government of Punjab, the government of India, BJP, RSS, and Congress put a lot of pressure, but the SGPC members firmly stood with their mother party Shiromani Akali Dal and set an example. He said that the results of this election are a

Punjab Police neutralized gangster in Amritsar

According to the statement to the media her today, DIG (Deputy Inspector General Police) Satinder Singh the accused gangsters were brought to the police station Beas for interrogation. Further, two gangsters namely Gursharan and Paras were brought to the spot where they had concealed the weapons according to their disclosure statement to police.

However, the two gangsters suddenly pushed back the police officials after reaching the place and ran in the opposite direction of their disclosure statement. In a surprise move, they fired upon the police party after getting possession of their weapons behind the bushes, said DIG.

Adding further DIG said that the police party too retaliated in self defence and consequently one gangster Gursharan has been hit and neutralized. The second gangster, while firing upon the police party, managed to escape in Mand area (having long height jungle grass) after jumping into the river.

DIG further informed that the accused were held in various criminal cases including murder case.

Five drug addict accused arrested for robbing two liquor shops

Sadar Police station Dabwali arrested a gang of five accused in two cases of robbery at the liquor shops at village Maujgarh and Matdadu in the district. Police recovered the bike, pistol and iron sticks used in the crime from the arrested accused. The arrested accused were identified as Nishan and Arshdeep resident of Abubshahar, Sukhbir alias Bawra resident of Dabwali, Jaspreet alias Gauri resident of Maujgarh and Gurwinder Singh alias Ravi alias Titu resident of Shiv Nagar Dabwali. Arshdeep, Gurvinder and Jaspreet were working in a welding shop. Whereas, Nishan and Sukhbir were daily wagers. All of them were addicted to drugs and liquor. Inspector Brahmprakash, in-charge of Sadar police station of Dabwali, said that on October 23, Abhijeet resident of village Semri, police station Patan, district Palamu, Jharkhand working as a salesman at a liquor shop in village Maujgarh made a complaint that in the evening two masked youths came to the shop and took away 20 thousand rupees kept in the cash box at gunpoint along with few liquor bottles.

Haryana Govt should ensure free treatment for Dengue-Malaria Patients: Selja

The General Secretary of the All India Congress Committee, former Union Minister, and Member of Parliament from Sirsa, Kumari Selja said that the BJP government is directly responsible for the increase in dengue and other fever cases in the state. The state government did not conduct fogging as a precautionary measure in anticipation of dengue, nor did it make efforts to raise awareness among the public. Due to the rapid increase in dengue-malaria cases in the state over the past month, people are turning to private hospitals for treatment. In such a situation, the state government should ensure proper and free treatment for patients suffering from dengue, malaria, and other fevers.

In a statement released to the media, Kumari Selja said that the BJP government has no concern for the health of the state's people. Cases of gross negligence in the health department continue to emerge from various corners of the state every week. Despite this, neither have health services been improved, nor has any step been taken to rectify the deteriorating condition of the health department. The former Union Minister Selja questioned why the BJP government did not prepare in advance when the dengue, malaria, and other fever season arrives every year. Neither fogging was done in cities and villages, nor were mosquito nets distributed in areas declared sensitive due to malaria and other fevers. Furthermore, adequate arrangements for the treatment of dengue patients in government hospitals were also not made. Even though the number of patients with dengue, malaria, and other fevers is increasing rapidly compared to previous years, the BJP government remains silent. Kumari Selja said that thousands of posts for lab technicians, paramedical staff, doctors, and specialist doctors are vacant in the health department. Many of these positions have not even had the recruitment process initiated. She also said that thousands of positions for medical and paramedical staff are vacant across the state, including radiologists, staff nurses, radiographers, MPHWS (Multipurpose Health Workers), lab technicians, pharmacists, and ortho assistants.

In the follow-up investigations in the 105 kg heroin haul case, Punjab Police have arrested one more associate of Turkey-based drug smuggler Navpreet Singh alias Nav Bhullar and recovered an additional chunk of 6kg heroin from his possession, taking the total recovery to 111 kg in this case, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here in a statement on Monday.

The arrested accused has been identified as Lovepreet



Singh, a resident of Village Chakoki in Kapurthala. Apart from recovering heroin consignment from his possession, police teams have also impounded his Hyundai Auracar (HR26FF4067), in which the accused was travelling.

The development came a day after Counter Intelligence (CI) Amritsar has busted a cross-

border smuggling racket after arresting two associates of drug smuggler Nav Bhullar and recovered 105kg heroin, 31.93 Kg Caffeine Anhydrous and 17 Kg dextromethorphan (DMR) and six weapons from their possession.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that while developing the further intelligence and establishing

forward-backward linkages in this case, CI Amritsar figured out that another associate Lovepreet Singh has received a huge consignment of heroin from Rajasthan, which he planned to supply to his associates based in Punjab.

Acting swiftly, Police teams led by DSP CI Amritsar Balbir Singh laid a special naka in the area of Village Umranangal Morh along the Jalandhar-Amritsar GT Road and apprehended accused Lovepreet Singh after recovering 6 Kg Heroin from his car.

The DGP said that preliminary investigation has revealed that arrested accused Lovepreet Singh picked up heroin consignment from district Hanumanagarh in Rajasthan and was going to deliver it to drug peddler Navjot Singh, who was arrested with 105kg heroin.

Haryana government action against farmers burning stubble in open: 100 FIRs, 360 fined Rs 10 lakh, 25 employees suspended

In view of Supreme Court of India directions, the administration ordered cases against those burning stubble in the open. However, later CM Naib Saini said that our farmers are wise, they will not burn stubble and no case will be registered.

After new incidents of stubble burning or arson were reported in the state on Saturday, the administration and agriculture department became strict. On Saturday, cases of stubble



burning were reported from 15 places, with the total figure of the state having exceeded 642. Most stubble has been burnt in Kaithal, Karnal and Ambala districts. A case of stubble burn-

ing has also been found in Gurugram, which till now was zero. According to information, 100 FIRs, 360 cases of fine and nearly 25 employees including officers have been suspended in the case.

Haryana state so far in view of strict action by Supreme Court of India asked to lodge a complaint with the police against those who burn stubble. The administration and the depart-

ment will take action based on the information received through HARSAC and its own sources. At the same time, the Agriculture Department has increased the number of teams at the block level. Information is being collected by conducting continuous surveys in the villages. However, awareness camps are being organized by the department at the village level. In these camps, farmers are being told about the disadvantages and advantages of burning stubble.

Haryana's 19 years old 'Lady Don' working for gangsters arrested on the Indo-Nepal border

On October 22, gangster Bhau instructed lady don Anu Dhankar to vacate the PG House at Kota in Rajasthan, come to the USA via Nepal and Dubai to lead a luxurious life in the USA. Accordingly, she reached Lakhimpur in UP via Lucknow, where she was waiting to cross the border at the appropriate time on the instructions of Bhau. Meanwhile, a team of Special Cell reached there and arrested her.

Special Cell of Delhi Police arrested Anu Dhankar (19), a resident of Rohtak in Haryana, a close girl friend of gangster Himanshu alias Bhau gang presently operating his criminal network in the country from abroad and accused of murder in Burger King restaurant in Rajouri Garden area of New Delhi. Annu was arrested from Lakhimpur in Uttar Pradesh, located near the Indo-Nepal border. She was



absconding since after the murder and was most wanted by Delhi police, declared a fugitive on 23 September being brought to Delhi for further legal action in the case.

Amit Kaushik, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Special Cell of Delhi said, three youths came on a bike to Burger King located at Najafgarh Road, Rajouri Garden, Delhi on 18th June 18 this year, when one of the accused stood outside the restaurant on the bike and two others went

inside the Burger King restaurant and started firing. They fired about 20-25 rounds from close range on Aman, a resident of village Chochi in Jhajjar (Haryana) member of a rival gang who was sitting inside the restaurant who died on the spot. Later, Himanshu Bhau Gang took responsibility for this incident. Several teams of Delhi Police comprising Inspector Puran Pant, Inspector Ravi Tushir, Inspector Kulveer and Vikram started investigating of murder case led by ACP

Rahul Kumar Singh and arrested Bijendra alias Golu, a resident of Ritoli in Rohtak district Haryana on June 27. Bijendra alias Golu identified the accused as Ashish alias Lahu a resident of Village Kharia in District Hisar, Haryana, Vikas alias Vicky, resident of Village-Ridhana, District Jhajjar, Haryana and Annu Dhankar, resident of Rohtak, Haryana.

Information reveals that during investigation, the role of lady don Anu Dhankar was found prime accused in the case. She had called victim Aman to Burger King Restaurant at Rajouri Garden in Delhi for friendship and at the same time gave information to Himanshu alias Bhau and his companion Sahil Ritoliya, after this, Ashish alias Lahu, Vikas alias Vicky and Bijendra alias Golu were sent to Burger King Restaurant by Himanshu alias Bhau and Sahil Ritoliya to create a scene. Anu Dhankar was last seen at Katra Railway Station on

June 19th and 24th with nowhere to move after this. However, the other two accused involved in the firing incident Ashish alias Lahu and Vikas alias Vicky were killed in a police encounter in Sonipat area on July 12.

Information reveals Annu Dhankar's name was also brought up in the firing incident at the famous Maturam Halwai shop in Gohana on January 21, and since then she disappeared from Rohtak and came to Delhi. Information also reveals that Himanshu alias Bhau and Sahil Ritoliya had assured her to arrange her visa and other documents for immigration to USA at their own expense enabling that she will lead a luxurious life in USA as such under the instructions of Bhau, she had approached Aman for friendship through social media on the day of the incident and called Aman to meet her at Burger King Restaurant.

He is accompanied by Union Minister Kiren Rijiju. Manipur Chief Minister N. Biren Singh is also likely to visit Tawang during this time. Ahead of the visit, the Defence Minister posted on his X handle that he was looking forward to meeting the Armed Forces personnel deployed at the forward area. "Leaving New Delhi for Tawang on a two-day visit to

Arunachal Pradesh. Looking forward to interact with Armed Forces personnel and attend the inaugural ceremony of a museum dedicated to brave Indian Army officer Major Ralengnao Bob Kha-thing," Rajnath Singh's post read. Major Ralengnao Bob Kha-thing was instrumental in bringing Tawang to Arunachal Pradesh under the Indian Union, and the museum is a tribute to his bravery.

Rajnath Singh's visit to Tawang comes at a time when India and China reached a breakthrough in patrolling along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Eastern Ladakh. Last week

India said that it had reached an agreement with China on patrolling along the LAC in eastern Ladakh. This was later confirmed by China. This is considered to be a major breakthrough in ending the four-year-long military stand-off, which began after Indian and Chinese troops got engaged in a violent confrontation in Galwan Valley in May 2020.

The Defence Minister visited the forward posts in Arunachal Pradesh in October 2023 also and carried out an on-ground assessment of the operational preparedness of the armed forces along the LAC. He also participated in a 'Shastra Puja' with the troops at Tawang, and celebrated Dussehra with them. The Minister also interacted with the soldiers deployed in frontline locations along the LAC. In the last few years, Tawang has become one of the focal points of friction between India and China, especially in areas like Yangtse, where soldiers of the Indian Army and China's People's Liberation Army (PLA) clashed in December 2022 leading to injuries on both sides.

EC's goal is to strip itself of the last vestiges of neutrality: Congress slams poll body



NEW DELHI: After the Election Commission of India (ECI) rejected the Congress' allegations of irregularities in the recent Haryana Assembly elections, calling the claims of EVM tampering "baseless", Congress General Secretary Jai Ram Ramesh on Friday came up with the grand old party's counter-response to the poll body alleging that its goal is to strip itself of the last vestiges of neutrality.

Sharing a letter written by the party on X, Ramesh said: "The ECI gave a non-reply to Congress' specific complaints in 20 Vidhan Sabha constituencies in Haryana. Here is the INC's response to this non-reply."

Ramesh said that the ECI has not replied to its specific problem, rather it has given a generic answer to its complaints. "The answer given to the question of the machines' fluctuating batteries seeks to confuse rather than clarify. At any rate, the ECI reply is nothing more than a standard and generic set of bullets on how the machines function rather than a specific clarification on specific complaints. While our complaints were specific, the ECI response is generic and focused on diminishing the complaints and the petitioners," Ramesh said in a post on X on Friday.

The poll body had also asked Congress and other political parties to avoid raising "frivolous and unfounded doubts". On this, the letter said: "If we were bad faith actors, then we would never engage with the ECI to begin with. We would not painstakingly document our grievances and present them with legal precedents and arguments. Instead, we would focus on naming and shaming the Commission with examples from the ECI's own recent history which do not shroud it with glory... We would point out how the ECI never published a dissent note, actively suppressing it instead, by a former Commissioner in this regard. We would point out that the ECI has almost always fought any move for transparency and an increase in VVPAT verification numbers, with the same having to be ordered by the Supreme Court. We challenge the ECI to fact-check the above since it finds the INC's misgivings to be based on phantoms." The letter further said: "The tone of the Commission's communications to the INC is a matter that we refuse to take lightly anymore. One Army jawan killed, 8 injured in road accident in South Kashmir's Kulgam

A road accident occurred on Saturday morning in the Damhal Hanjipora area of Kulgam district of South Kashmir, resulting in the death of one army jawan and injuries to eight others.

According to officials, the army vehicle carrying the personnel skidded off the road and plunged into a deep gorge, leading to severe injuries. The injured soldiers were promptly evacuated by police and army personnel and taken to a nearby hospital for treatment.

Police have initiated an investigation into the accident.

The incident follows a series of recent attacks in Jammu and Kashmir. On Thursday, militants ambushed an army vehicle in the Botapathri area of Baramulla, killing three soldiers and two porters. The attackers, believed to be militants from Pakistan, used armour-piercing bullets, according to an Army spokesman.

Congress leader Rashid Alvi urges for transparency on agreements with China



NEW DELHI: On Sunday, Congress leader Rashid Alvi called for the disclosure of the specific issues on which agreements have been reached between India and China. Responding to the statement made by External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar regarding the situation on the Line of Actual Control (LAC), the Congress leader said, "Jaishankar should disclose the specific issues on which agreements have been reached with China, as well as those still pending." He added that a copy of any agreement made should be made public so that people understand the details, as the country does not trust China. "While the Prime Minister and EAM Jaishankar may trust China, the Chief of Army Staff has contradicted their stance, stating that China's forces cannot be trusted until they fully withdraw like it was back in October 2020," said Rashid Alvi. The EAM credited the recent breakthrough agreement with China regarding patrols along the LAC to the military, which operated under "very, very unimaginable" conditions, and to skilled diplomacy. During an interaction with students in Pune, EAM Jaishankar earlier on Saturday, noted that it is still somewhat early for the normalisation of relations, as rebuilding trust and a willingness to collaborate will naturally take time.

PM Modi launches health projects worth Rs 12,850 cr on Ayurveda Day

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday launched, inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for multiple projects related to the health sector worth around Rs 12, 850 crore at All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA) in the national capital as part of the celebration of Dhanvantari Jayanti and 9th Ayurveda Day.

PM Modi said the "amalgamation of knowledge of Ayurveda with Modern medicine" has brought a new chapter in the health sector in the last 10 years.

"India is looking at the health sector as holistic health," PM Modi said while outlining the five pillars of health policy -- preventive healthcare, early detection of ailments, free and low-cost treatment and medicines, availability of doctors in small towns and lastly expansion of technology in health services.

The healthcare projects worth Rs 12, 850 crore include four centres of excellence under the Ayush Health Scheme, expansion of health services with the use of drones, helicopter service in AIIMS-Rishikesh, new infrastructure in AIIMS-New Delhi and AIIMS-Bilaspur, expansion of services in five other AIIMS in the country, establishment of medical colleges, 'bhoomi puja' of nursing colleges and other projects related to the health sector. Inaugurating pharma units, the PM said, "These would play a key role in the manufacturing of advanced medicine and high-quality stents and implants and further India's growth."

On the flagship Ayushman



Bharat Yojana scheme, he noted that "about four crore poor people in the country have benefited by getting treated without having to pay a single rupee." He added that the scheme has now been expanded to cover healthcare expenses of elderly above 70 years of age, which will also reduce a family's out-of-pocket expenditure for healthcare.

"Every elderly person above 70 years of age in the country will get free treatment in the hospital by an Ayushman Vaya Vandana Card," PM Modi said, stating that "the card was universal and there was no restriction on income, be it poor or middle class or upper class".

Further, the Prime Minister also mentioned the launch of more than 14, 000 PM Jan Aushadhi Kendras across the country where medicines are available at an 80 per cent discount -- a significant reduction in the cost of treatment for both poor and middle-class families. "The poor and middle class have managed to save Rs 30, 000 crore due to availability of cheap medicines," he informed, adding that the

"prices of devices like stents and knee implants have also been reduced, which prevented a loss of more than Rs 80, 000 crores by the common citizens". He also mentioned the free dialysis scheme and Mission Indradhanush campaign to prevent fatal diseases and save the lives of pregnant women and newborn babies.

The PM said that more than "two lakh Ayushman Arogya Mandirs have been established across the country to facilitate early diagnosis and treatment". He noted that the e-Sanjeevani scheme has helped over 30 crore people with free online doctor consultations.

PM Modi also announced the launch of the U-win platform which will provide India with a technologically advanced interface in the health sector, while highlighting the unprecedented progress made in India's healthcare sector over the past decade.

The Prime Minister also inaugurated several hospitals in Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, and Andhra Pradesh; laid the foundation stone for new medical colleges

in Narsapur and Bommasandra in Karnataka, Pithampur in Madhya Pradesh, Achitapuram in Andhra Pradesh, and Faridabad in Haryana.

"The increasing number of hospitals reflects a proportional rise in medical seats," the PM said, informing that nearly one lakh new MBBS and MD seats have been added over the past 10 years, and also reiterated the commitment to announcing another 75, 000 seats in the next five years.

While noting that 7.5 lakh registered AYUSH practitioners are already contributing to the nation's healthcare, the PM stressed increasing the number further. He also highlighted the growing demand for medical and wellness tourism in India. Meanwhile, the Prime Minister also announced the launch of the Prakriti Parikshan Abhiyan aimed at designing ideal lifestyles and risk analysis for individuals using Ayurveda principles. He emphasised that this initiative can redefine the healthcare sector globally and provide a new perspective for the entire world.

He also underscored the importance of validating traditional herbs like Ashwagandha, turmeric, and black pepper through high-impact scientific studies.

"Lab validation of our traditional healthcare systems will not only increase the value of these herbs but also create a significant market," he remarked, pointing to the rising demand for Ashwagandha, which is projected to reach \$2.5 billion by the end of this decade.

Incidentally, so far her campaign has evoked a massive response as she has been able to walk into the hearts of many.

India Launches 21st Livestock Census to Enhance Animal Health Security and Policy Development

NEW DELHI: Union Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh officially launched the 21st Livestock Census on Friday, emphasising the significance of accurate data in shaping government policies for animal health security and promoting growth within the sector.

The census will run from October 2024 to February 2025, with a budget of Rs 200 crore funded entirely by the central government.

This initiative aims to collect comprehensive data on 219 indigenous breeds across 16 species, involving approximately 100,000 field officials, primarily veterinarians and para-veterinarians, in the enumeration process. Addressing the launch event, Singh stressed the importance of conducting the census with "full honesty and sincerity," urging ministry officials to monitor the operation closely.

The data gathered is expected to aid in developing strategies to improve animal health, control diseases, and enhance breed improvement.

Notably, Singh pointed out that despite India being the world's largest milk producer, it has struggled to export dairy



products significantly.

In conjunction with the census, Singh also announced the establishment of a USD 25 million 'Pandemic Fund Project' aimed at bolstering animal health security in India for better pandemic preparedness and response. Amitabh Kant, G20 Sherpa, underscored the critical link between animal health and human health, stating that strengthening animal health security could help mitigate the risk of zoonotic diseases that often lead to human pandemics.

Kant emphasized that animal diseases can devastate the livestock industry, a vital income source for millions of Indian

farmers. The upcoming livestock census represents a critical component of national strategies for food security, poverty alleviation, and rural development.

It will capture detailed data on 15 livestock species, including cattle, buffalo, sheep, goats, pigs, and more, alongside poultry counts from various households and institutions.

This door-to-door survey, conducted every five years since 1919, serves as the backbone for policy formulation and implementation in the animal husbandry sector.

The previous census took place in 2019, and the latest iteration will leverage mobile

technology for data collection, enhancing both the accuracy and efficiency of the process.

The 21st Livestock Census is set to cover over 30 crore households nationwide, ensuring comprehensive data collection from diverse communities, including nomadic groups and pastoralists.

The focus will extend to gender roles in livestock management, breed management, and animal health, aiming to highlight areas that require intervention for improving rural livelihoods.

Ministers of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, and Dairying, S P Singh Baghel and George Kurian, also attended the launch.

Baghel commended the department's preparation efforts for the census, while Kurian noted the livestock sector's significant contribution to the GDP and employment, particularly in rural areas.

PM Narendra Modi distributes over 51,000 appointment letters to youth



NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday distributed over 51, 000 appointment letters to newly appointed young recruits in government departments and organisations via video conferencing, marking a significant step towards youth employment.

Extending his Diwali greetings, PM Modi noted, "This year's Diwali is particularly special. You might wonder why. After 500 years, Lord Shri Ram is now seated in his grand temple in Ayodhya, making this the first Diwali celebrated since his installation. Many generations have awaited this mo-

ment, and countless people have sacrificed and endured hardships for it. We are all fortunate to witness such a special Diwali."

PM Modi expressed his best wishes to the new recruits, stating, "On this auspicious day, 51, 000 appointment letters for government jobs are being distributed. The process of providing permanent government jobs to lakhs of youth in India continues. Lakhs of youth in BJP and NDA-ruled states have also received appointment letters." Focusing on Haryana, PM Modi added, "With the formation of a new government, 26 lakh youth in

Haryana have been given the gift of employment, and they are happy. Our government stands out because it provides jobs without 'kharchi' and 'parch' (without bribes and influence). I extend special congratulations to the youth who have received appointment letters in Haryana." The Prime Minister highlighted the extensive infrastructure development underway in the country, with projects ranging from expressways to fibre lines, schools, and colleges. "These projects are aimed not only at improving infrastructure but also at reducing logistics costs and creating employment opportunities," he said. Recalling his recent visit to Vadodra, PM Modi shared, "Yesterday, I inaugurated a factory that manufactures aircraft for the defence sector. This factory will directly employ thousands, with further opportunities generated as small factories emerge to produce spare parts. MSMEs will contribute to this sector, creating a cascade of employment."

'Mediocre' India outlook merits policy attention

The recent World Economic Outlook from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) offers both encouraging news and warnings for the global economy. While a much-feared global recession has been averted and inflation is moderating, challenges persist, particularly with food prices and high services inflation in emerging economies. In the short term, the global growth outlook remains stable, with the U.S. outperforming initial growth projections for 2023, offsetting slower growth in some European nations. Although economic strains are visible in regions like West Asia, sub-Saharan Africa, and Central Asia due to conflicts, emerging Asian economies, notably China and India, are bolstered by public investments, mitigating the overall impact. For India, the IMF forecasts steady growth at 7 per cent for 2024-25, slightly moderating to 6.5 per cent in subsequent years. The report links this softening to the gradual exhaustion of the "pent-up demand" that fueled the post-pandemic rebound. This trend is evident in declining sales of cars and consumer goods, particularly in urban centres. However, a robust monsoon and improving rural incomes could potentially strengthen demand in the near term, though these factors are not guaranteed to sustain momentum. A longer-term concern raised by the IMF is the global growth forecast of a "mediocre" 3.1 per cent over the next five years, marking a decline from pre-pandemic trends. Amid rising protectionist policies, India's economic trajectory may increasingly rely on domestic demand. To capitalise on this, both central and state policymakers must focus on accelerating reforms. The IMF has recommended making India more accessible to global trade and investment by reducing import tariffs and FDI restrictions, alongside "ambitious" domestic reforms to boost competition and private investments. For India, these measures could be important in sustaining growth amid an increasingly uncertain global economic landscape.

Solar empowers women



Until Charles Fritts installed the first rooftop photovoltaic solar array using 1%-efficient selenium cells on a roof in New York City in 1884, the sun was a humble driving force behind photosynthesis, evaporation, and countless natural processes. Today, apart from being the major factor in the climate patterns that sustains life on earth, it is also a transformative, democratising force in electricity generation. Distinct from traditional sources such as coal, oil, gas, nuclear, and hydropower, which require extensive infrastructure and intermediary transmission lines, solar energy can now be harnessed directly at its point of use — in homes. It is now a home product.

Decentralisation of power generation has significant implications for both environmental sustainability and societal structures. The ability to generate energy close to where it is consumed unlocks a cascade of benefits beyond mere convenience. Socially, economically, and developmentally, solar places power — literally and figuratively — into the hands of individuals and communities, breaking down barriers that have long excluded them from the energy economy. This shift empowers people, particularly women, making them direct participants in the economy and catalysts for change.

Women often bear the brunt of poor energy access, impacting their health, safety, and economic potential. Solar addresses this. In Gujarat's Little Rann of Kutch, women salt farmers have transitioned from expensive diesel to solar pumps, boosting their income by 94% and reducing CO2 emissions by up to 1,15,000 metric tons annually. Initiatives such as the Barefoot College (India), the Grameen Shakti (Bangladesh), and Solar Sister (Africa) empower women to become solar engineers, benefiting millions and improving community health and safety. For example, We Care Solar's suitcases reduced perinatal deaths by 72% in Uganda's health centres.

Solar, especially through localised solutions, is advancing women's financial inclusion and enabling income generation directed towards education, health care, and other essential activities. By integrating women across the value chain — from end-users to entrepreneurs — solar is driving societal progress and elevating the status of women. In fact, solar employs more women than any other energy sector. In 2022, the solar photovoltaic industry alone provided jobs to around 4.9 million people, with women accounting for 40% of the workforce. With India's ambitious renewable targets, the sector is expected to create three million new jobs by 2030, offering significant opportunities for women if the current trends hold. No other energy project comes close to this potential.

Challenges

Solar also uplifts marginalised communities. Unlike coal, which has impoverished resource-rich regions, solar offers a sustainable path forward. India's coal mining districts exemplify the 'resource curse', where local communities suffer from poor health, education, and living conditions, with over 50% in poverty.

Distributed solar systems link energy produc-

tion with community well-being, driving climate resilience. Off-grid projects provide clean energy to areas without traditional electricity, supporting economic development in rural regions. Rooftop installations and mini-grids offer scalable, eco-friendly solutions, creating local jobs without the environmental impact of large-scale projects.

Effective community engagement is crucial for the success of these projects. For instance, in India, formalised community institutions such as self-help groups, farmer-producer organisations, and panchayati raj institutions are integral to village infrastructure planning. Where formal structures are absent, rural energy committees can oversee mini-grid operations, encompassing everything from planning and installation to tariff determination and maintenance, which ensure that energy access is thorough and benefits the entire community.

As solar technology progresses, three challenges persist: geographical imbalance, with most investments concentrated in developed nations leaving developing countries, particularly Africa, lagging; sectoral imbalance is evident as large-scale solar farms receive the majority of funding while smaller, crucial applications such as solar pumps and cold storages are overlooked; manufacturing concentration in just two countries disrupts supply chains and inflates prices, a problem set to intensify with rising global demand. The challenge at the home level will be to ensure easy availability and affordability of solar. This will require robust government and market support.

The second is to focus on the life cycle of solar technologies, with an emphasis on recycling and circularity to manage waste. Establishing clear guidelines for processing solar photovoltaic materials is vital, ensuring that they contribute to sustainability rather than exacerbate waste issues. A robust framework should mandate producer responsibility and involve government and end-of-life management collaboration, fostering efficient recycling and encouraging recycling plants and implementing stringent waste management processes are crucial for enhancing the environmental and economic health of the solar sector.

Policies and gender

A just energy transition is more than a shift from fossil fuels to renewables. It is about ensuring that all communities, especially those historically sidelined, benefit from the change. For solar energy to truly empower communities, it must be inclusive and equitable, positioning women not just as beneficiaries but also as pivotal change agents. This necessitates a re-evaluation of energy policies through a gender lens.

Current national-level electricity access policies often lack this perspective, limiting their effectiveness in combating inequality. It is crucial for electrification initiatives to integrate with sectors such as agriculture, forestry, and rural development to form a holistic approach to energy access. This integration helps to dismantle the systemic barriers that disproportionately affect women, fostering a more inclusive energy economy. With this, we can ensure that solar supports environmental sustainability, drives socio-economic development, and becomes a true catalyst for a liveable planet.

The shifting sands within global supply chains

Global supply chains are at an inflection point. While the COVID-19 pandemic shifted the focus from efficiency (just in time) to resilience (just in case), two developments in September 2024 indicate that another shift is underway in how supply chains are envisioned and operationalised — this time towards security (just to be secure).

Moves by the U.S. and Israel's pager attack

On September 23, the United States Department of Commerce proposed rules which, if accepted "would prohibit the import or sale of certain connected vehicle systems designed, developed, manufactured, or supplied by entities with a sufficient nexus to the PRC or Russia". The proposed rules target both the software and hardware associated with vehicle connectivity systems as well as automated driving systems. While the 100% tariffs on Chinese EVs announced by the U.S. earlier this year stemmed from competition concerns aimed at reducing their sale in the domestic market, the newly proposed rules, which stem from national security concerns, would effectively ban their sale in the U.S.

The U.S. case against Chinese connected car tech is that both hardware and software components in cars employing some form of external communication capabilities can be potentially misused. The idea is that cars with connected car tech are essentially mobile listening posts, and that malicious actors can use their cameras and sensors for espionage purposes. Worse, these cars may even be disabled or hijacked — especially those level 3 and above on the Society of Automotive Engineers' levels of driving automation. For



security hawks, handing over such control to a state with which you may be in a future conflict simply carries overwhelming risks.

If there was any strand of thought moderating the hawkish focus on supply chain security, that evaporated as the world came to terms with the Israeli supply chain attack, on September 17-18, targeting pagers and walkie-talkies used by Hezbollah in Lebanon. More than 30 people including children were killed while thousands were injured. The fallout was felt far and wide leaving everyone wondering about the state of advanced technologies used or embedded in products across industries when even basic old-fashioned devices could be made to explode.

While the U.S. proposed rules and the Israeli pager attack have reignited and amplified the supply chain security debate, it arguably began a few years ago when the U.S., Australia, Japan and even India effectively banned Huawei and other Chinese telecom players from participating in the 5G rollout for security considerations. The motivating fear was that China could install backdoors in the telecom infrastructure giving it the capability to surveil or sabotage the same.

Since then, supply chain security concerns have spread to other tech industries such as semiconductors.

From efficiency to resilience to security

During the heydays of globalisation, especially from the 1980s till the 2010s, supply chains were configured to ensure maximum efficiency; that is, weaving a complex supply chain for each product or service in a way that components were procured and assembled at various locations across the world based on cost and other considerations. These "just in time" supply chains were to some extent immune from great power politics. China established itself as a central supply node in this arrangement. A combination of various factors in the late 2010s and early 2020s such as the U.S.-China rivalry and resultant technology decoupling and the COVID-19 pandemic shifted the focus away from "just in time" to "just in case".

That is, there was a recognition in the U.S., Europe, India and elsewhere that supply chains had become too dependent on Chinese exports. Supply chain resilience, as a result, became all the rage. But, almost simultaneously, security considerations around Chinese involvement in telecom infrastructure also led to another shift — from resilience to security. This shift has only solidified in the wake of Israel's supply chain attack.

India and supply chain security

How can India ensure that its supply chains are secure? Extreme measures such as outright

banning import of a range of tech products and services would not work. Neither would fully subscribing to the "just in case" strategy that focuses on supply chain resilience.

What can work is a two-pronged approach involving both "just to be secure" and "just in case" strategies. The "just to be secure" strategy can be put in motion through "trust but verify" and "zero trust." Certain tech products and services (say those used in communications, transport or critical infrastructure broadly defined) can be subjected to trust but verify entailing methods such as periodic audits, on-site inspections, and establishment of a mechanism that ensures compliance with national and international security standards. But a more narrowly defined set of technologies that are most critical (say those used by Indian military, intelligence agencies, or for cutting edge research and development) should be subjected to zero trust. Assuming by default that all tech products and services are compromised and applicable to friends and foes alike, zero trust would entail developing the most stringent checks during procurement as well as continuous monitoring and verification. For all the rest less critical technologies, the "just in case" strategy involving diversification of vendors and friendshoring would suffice in taking care of larger supply chain concerns about cascading fallout due to single points of vulnerabilities and failures.

Crossing Boundaries: Book tells tales of Indian-Chinese relation

In *Rebels, Traitors, Peacemakers*, authors Shivaji Das and Yolanda Yu delve into a complex love story, one that transcends personal experiences to reflect on broader social and cultural implications of cross-cultural relationships. Through the lens of 32 Indian-Chinese couples, this powerful book explores the challenges and triumphs of navigating love across geographical, cultural, and political boundaries in an increasingly polarized world.

The authors, themselves a cross-cultural couple — Shivaji from India and Yolanda from China — bring authenticity and sensitivity to the subject, having experienced firsthand the biases and stereotypes that often accompany such relationships. Their personal journey, marked by their Indian-Chinese marriage, provides the emotional core of the book. When they met and married, Shivaji and Yolanda found themselves confronting not just cultural stereotypes but

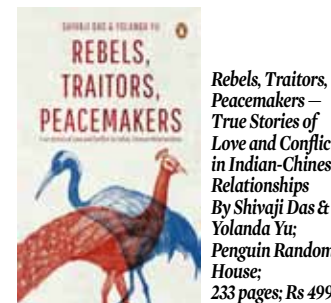
also the rigid social codes of their respective societies. By sharing the lives of couples who face similar challenges, they hope to shed light on the real experiences of those who, despite obstacles, dare to love beyond borders.

The structure of *Rebels, Traitors, Peacemakers* is both simple and impactful, with each chapter focusing on one couple's unique journey. The book is easy to read, with a crisp, straightforward style that captures the essence of each story without unnecessary embellishment. Each chapter serves as a detailed portrait, delving into the couples' experiences, their weddings, and the discrimination they faced along the way. Notably, all but one story documents relationships between Indian men and Chinese women, reflecting the broader societal acceptance patterns within this dynamic.

The stories are presented with neutrality, allowing each couple's voice to stand out without the authors' biases seeping through.

Through conversations with the couples, Das and Yu reveal how each partner perceives their cultural differences, the prejudices of their families, and the political tensions between their countries. Despite these difficulties, these couples ultimately find common ground and build new identities, not just as lovers but as "peacemakers." Their resilience, humour, and genuine affection shine through, making each story compelling and relatable.

The book is structured around a three-stage arc that many cross-cultural relationships go through. The first stage casts the couples as *rebels*, individuals who defy cultural norms and family expectations to pursue their love. This is followed by the second stage, where they face rejection and accusations of betrayal, becoming *traitors* in the eyes of some of their loved ones. Finally, they evolve into *peacemakers*, finding ways to reconcile cultural differences and create a shared identity

that bridges both worlds. This arc not only keeps the reader engaged but also serves as a thoughtful commentary on the universal journey of cross-cultural couples.

One particularly striking aspect of *Rebels, Traitors, Peacemakers* is its exploration of the similarities between Indian and Chinese cultures. Both societies place a high value on familial respect, ambition, fidelity, and loyalty. These shared values often help the couples find common ground, even as they grapple with the external pressures that come with cross-cultural unions. The authors also touch on a common trait between India and China: a certain sense of inferiority on the world stage that drives an almost obsessive ambition in the individuals. This dynamic, they argue, often

fuels the resilience needed to make such marriages work.

The catalyst for writing *Rebels, Traitors, Peacemakers* came from a disturbing incident in Singapore in 2022, where a man spat towards an Indian-Chinese couple, claiming the Chinese woman "should be with him." The authors, who live in Singapore, found this reaction surprising, given that one in five marriages in the city-state is interracial. Such incidents highlight the lingering prejudices that cross-cultural couples face even in seemingly cosmopolitan environments, adding urgency to the authors' goal of promoting empathy and understanding.

A heartwarming element of the book is its emphasis on hope and positivity. Despite the hardships, these couples demonstrate a shared commitment to mutual understanding and a deep desire for cultural exchange. The authors, in particular, discuss their mixed-race child, who, they believe, has the potential to bridge the world's two largest cultures. With the ability to speak and understand both Mandarin and Hindi, their child could grow up as a true global citizen, free from the biases and limitations that often divide communities.

Core Industries Output Rebounds to 2 pc in September amid Mixed Sectoral Performance

NEW DELHI: India's eight core industries recorded a modest recovery with 2 percent growth in September 2024, bouncing back from a revised 1.6 percent contraction in August, according to official data released by the Commerce and Industry Ministry on Wednesday.

However, the latest figures show a significant decline from the 9.5 percent growth registered in September 2023.

The first half of the fiscal year saw core sector growth moderate to 4.2 percent, down from 8.2 percent during the same period last year.

The core sector index, which comprises coal, natural gas, crude oil, refinery products, fertilizers, cement, steel, and electricity, represents 40.27 per-



cent of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP). Five sectors demonstrated positive growth in September, with cement leading at 7.1 percent, followed by refinery products at 5.8 percent, coal at 2.6 percent, fertilizers at 1.9 percent, and steel at 1.5 percent. However, crude oil ex-

perienced the steepest decline at -3.9 percent, while natural gas and electricity contracted by 1.3 percent and 0.5 percent respectively.

ICRA's Chief Economist Aditi Nayar attributed the turnaround to reduced rainfall-related disruptions in mining and electricity sectors. She noted that cement production reached a six-month high, while steel output recorded its slowest growth in 33 months.

ICRA projects IIP growth of 3-5 percent in September, supported by stronger GST e-way bill generation and favourable base effects.

Standard Chartered Bank's Head of India Economic Research, Anubhuti Sahay, expressed optimism for improved performance from October onward, despite current figures remaining below early-2024 levels. The government has also revised June's core sector growth to 5 percent, following July's 6.1 percent growth and May's final growth rate of 6.9 percent.

India's Economic Growth driven by its Strengths, not US-China Trade War: Goyal

NEW DELHI: India's Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal emphasised that India does not view the ongoing US-China trade tensions as a source of advantage, asserting instead that the nation relies on its inherent strengths.

Speaking at the Future Investment Initiative in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, Goyal highlighted India's democratic foundations, rule of law, and demographic advantages as key pillars of its economic potential. The statement comes amid escalating trade tensions between the United States and China, which intensified in May when the US implemented significant tariff increases.

These included 100 per cent duties on electric vehicles, 50 per cent on semiconductors, and 25



per cent on aluminium, steel, and batteries.

The US has also begun developing domestic semiconductor and battery production capabilities through subsidy programs.

Global supply chains have undergone considerable realignment in the post-COVID era, with many nations seeking to diversify their sources of critical materials.

While India has been frequently mentioned as a potential alternative to China, alongside other Southeast Asian economies, Goyal emphasised that India's appeal lies in its own merits rather than geopolitical circumstances.

Addressing concerns about the multilateral trade system, Goyal maintained an optimistic outlook while acknowledging current challenges.

He pointed to specific issues within the World Trade Organisation (WTO), including its non-functional appellate body for trade dispute resolution.

However, he cited India's successful bilateral resolution of seven WTO disputes with the United States as evidence of effective diplomatic engagement.

SWIGGY Limited proposing IPO of Rs 11,300 crores

Swiggy Limited proposes to open its initial public offering (IPO) of equity shares priced at Rs between Rs 371 to Rs 390 per share -- aggregating to Rs 11,300 crores -- with the offering opening on November 6, 2024 and closing on November 8, 2024. The Offer comprises of a Fresh Issue of Equity Shares -- aggregating to total Rs 44,990 million -- and Offer for Sale of 175,087 equity shares by the Selling Shareholders. Sriharsha Majety, Managing Director and Group Chief Executive Officer, said here recently that the company was expecting its CAGR to increase by around 10-11%, despite many other similar operators being in the market -- though their models didn't work as good as Swiggy's. Highlighting use of Rs 982.40 crore investment in Scootsy for expansion of 'dark' stores network in the quick commerce segment, and also Rs 559.10 crore allocation towards setting up dark stores, he said the company would continue to increase its geographical coverage, while also increasing availability of more items and substantially reduced delivery time.

Maruti-Suzuki India logs 18 pc drop in net profit at Rs 3,069 crore in Q2



NEW DELHI: Maruti Suzuki India on Tuesday reported nearly 18 per cent drop in net profit at Rs 3,069 crore in the second quarter this fiscal (FY25), from Rs 3,716 crore in the same quarter last year. According to India's largest automaker and change in tax rate on long term capital gains on debt mutual funds as per the Finance Act 2024. During the quarter, the company registered net sales of Rs 35,589 crore against Rs 35,535 crore in the same period of the previous year. For the first six months of the current fiscal (H1 FY25), the company clocked net profit at Rs 6,719 crore, a growth from Rs 6,201 crore in H1 FY24. The company's stock went down almost 5.7 per cent at Rs 10,829.05 apiece on Tuesday after its financial results. Maruti Suzuki India sold a total of 541,550 vehicles during the quarter, of which the domestic market volume was 463,834 vehicles and the export volume was 77,716 vehicles. While the domestic volume declined by 3.9 per cent, the export volume grew by 12.1 per cent compared to the same period of the previous year, said the company. For the first half in the current fiscal, the company sold a total of 1,063,418 units, comprising 915,142 units in the domestic market and at 148,276 units in the export market.

Pending MSME Payments Soar to Rs 21,108 Cr Across 90,000 Applications in Samadhan Portal

NEW DELHI: A mounting backlog of payments to micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) has reached Rs 21,108 crore across 90,000 applications, according to recent data from the MSME Samadhaan portal.

The portal, which tracks delayed payments from government entities, reveals state governments as the largest defaulters with pending dues of Rs 3,170 crore, while central public sector undertakings follow with Rs 2,191 crore in outstanding payments. The Micro and Small Enterprises Facilitation Council has already converted 40,000 applications, worth Rs 13,199 crore, into formal cases.



This development comes as the government strengthens its efforts to address the persistent challenge of delayed payments in the MSME sector. A senior MSME ministry official, speaking on condition

of anonymity, highlighted the role of the Trade Receivables Discounting System (TReDS) in addressing these payment delays. "TReDS portal provides bill discounting facilities, which is helping tackle delayed payment issues of the MSMEs. We are working on making TReDS more effective," the official stated.

Under the MSME Development Act, buyers are required to make payments within 45 days of purchase from MSMEs. Failure to meet this deadline results in a penalty interest rate of three times the prevalent bank rate on the outstanding amount.

To further encourage timely payments, the government introduced amendments to the Income Tax Act last year, making pending MSME payments ineligible for deduction from the entity's income, thereby incentivising prompt settlement of dues.

Six IPOs likely to launch in the next 2-3 weeks

Even as India gets into festival mode, the next 2-3 weeks herald another interesting activity. The IPO market is expected to be active in the coming weeks, with six companies from various sectors set to launch initial public offerings (IPOs).

NTPC Green Energy, Acme Solar, Mobikwik, Sagility India, Zinka Logistics, and Niva Bupa have received final clearance from SEBI, with NTPC Green still awaiting final observation, according to sources.

NTPC Green Energy Ltd, India's largest renewable public-sector company (excluding hydro), has 14,696 MW of projects, with 2,925 MW already operational and 11,771 MW contracted, besides, another 10,975 MW of capacity in development, bringing the total to 25,671 MW.

Reliance Industries was recently in news that it had filed over 3,000 patents in recent months, i.e., at a rate of 100 per week, in cutting edge technology areas such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), 6G, and 5G in India and abroad. Across the sectors, Indian companies are realizing the importance of Intellectual Capital. This holds true for the pharmaceutical sector in India as well as it is research-intensive sector. Indian pharmaceutical companies gain due to the expiry of patents on blockbuster drugs as many Indian companies can come up with generic products. Intangible assets of pharmaceutical companies comprise Computer Software, Marketing Intangibles/Brands, Technical know-how, Trademarks, Technologies, Non-compete rights, Trademark and Licences, Clinical Trials, Patents & Copyrights.

Integrated Reporting process guided by the principles and content element of the International Integrated Reporting Council's (IIRC) International Integrated Reporting Framework outlines financial and non-financial performance across the six resource capitals namely Fi-

ancial Capital, Manufactured Capital, Intellectual Capital, Human Capital, Social & Relationship Capital and Natural Capital.

In some of these top pharmaceutical companies in India, e.g., Mankind Pharma, Alkem Labs, Intellectual Capital primarily comprises brands whereas in others, significant emphasis is on other components such as Abbreviated New Drug Applications (ANDAs), Patents, etc. ANDA contains the data which is submitted to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the review and potential approval of a generic drug product. New Drug Application (NDA) is a type of application in which a pharmaceutical manufacturer or its agent requests permission from the regulatory body, e.g., the U.S. FDA in the USA, for a license to market a drug for one or more specified indications. As per the U.S. FDA, a Drug Master File (DMF) is a submission to the FDA which may be used to provide confidential detailed information about facilities, processes, or articles used in the manufacturing, processing, packaging, and storing of one or more human drugs.

Sun Pharmaceutical Industries holds number 1 position in terms of market capitalization and market share. The company has a diverse range of intangibles as listed in Table 1.



By March 31, 2024 Divi's Labs had a total of 41 Drug Master Files (DMFs) with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (USFDA), 26 Certificates of Suitability (CoS) filed with the European Directorate for the Quality of Medicines & Healthcare (EDQM) and referred as a Certificate of Suitability to the monographs of the European Pharmacopoeia (CEP), 25 DMFs with Health Canada and 7 DMFs with the Pharmaceuticals and Medical Devices Agency (PMDA), Japan. The company had also filed a total of 43 patents for generic products.

Cipla had 298 patents as of March 31, 2024 which were granted in FY 2023-24. In addition to this, the company had 2,204 cumulative DMFs and 277 cumulative ANDAs and NDAs filed. The company had successfully launched 101 new products across geographies. 298 patents were granted to Cipla in FY 2023-24. 11 brands of Cipla clocked Rs. 200 Crores in revenue as per IQVIA MAT March 2024 against 9 such brands in FY23. 11 brands with this much revenue makes Cipla the 2nd highest among all Indian Pharmaceutical Market (IPM) players. The company also completed successfully 10 clinical trials.

Till date, Torrent Pharma has been granted 684 patents out of 1,274 patent applications submitted. In FY 2023-24 alone, the company has filed 38 New Drug Delivery Systems (NDDS) patents and secured 2 API/Process/formulation patents.

Zydus Lifesciences received 46 ANDA approvals (including 5 tentative approvals) and filed 20 additional ANDAs with the USFDA in FY 2023-24. For APIs, the company

filed 4 DMFs with the USFDA, taking the cumulative US DMF filings to 142.

Dr. Reddy's Laboratories filed 241 dossiers, including 17 ANDAs and 2 NDAs taking cumulative ANDAs to 325. 86 Filings comprising 81 ANDAs and 5 NDAs were pending as on March 31, 2024. Of these, 54 were Para IVs and the company believed that 24 had 'First-to-File' Status. Integrated Annual Report of the company also showed that the company had filed 133 DMFs including 11 DMFs in the U.S. thereby taking Cumulative DMFs to 1,537 including 251 in the U.S. The number of DMFs filed stood at 134 in FY2023. The company launched 181 new products in FY2023-24.

Lupin Limited has provided comprehensive information on Intellectual Capital that comprised Novel Drug Discovery and Development (NDDD) applications, formulations, Active Pharmaceutical Ingredient (API), and Biotech as given in Table 2 and Table 3. In addition to this, the company has reported about Intellectual Capital and Patents in different countries for FY24 as well as Cumulative figures. Type of filing (number of dossiers) included NDA, ANDA, Abbreviated New Drug Submissions or ANDSs (Canada), Marketing Authorisation Applications (MAAs) in Europe, Australia, Brazil, South Africa, among others. In total, there were 33 filings, and 63 approvals

in FY24. Cumulative filings and Cumulative Approvals in all these markets stood at 684 and 506 respectively.

Strength of Mankind Pharma is in brands across segments as the company has 23 brand families worth over Rs. 100 Crore from 20 in FY23, and the count of Rs. 50 Crore brand families increased to 40 in FY24. Nine brands of the company are number 1 ranked brands, and 19 brands of the company are ranked among top 3. Mankind Pharma had 41 per cent revenue from Top 21 brands in FY2024. Overall, 21 of Mankind's brands fall in IPM's top 300 brands including 11 brand families worth above Rs. 200 Crore.

Aurobindo Pharma had filed 833 patent applications as on March 31, 2024 out of which 188 patents have been granted to the company. In December 2023, the company forayed into the Indonesian market with acquisition of market authorisations and assets related to 17 brands from Pfizer and Viatrix. During FY24, the company filed 40 ANDAs and received approvals for 68 ANDAs. As on March 31, 2024 the company had 830 ANDAs filed with the US FDA. In addition to this, it had filed 3,642 formulation dossiers in Europe, 291 DMFs with the US FDA, and 1,859 API dossiers in Europe.

Alkem Labs has a diversified portfolio of over 800

brands. 18 brands of the company figure in IPM Top 300 brands. In FY24, 19 of the company's brands had sales of more than Rs. 100 Crore each. These brands constituted more than half of the company's sales. Three of the company's brands namely Pan (rank 7), Clavam (rank 9), and Pan-D (rank 15) featured among the top 15 brands in the IPM during this period.

It has been observed for top Indian pharmaceutical companies that intellectual capital inputs comprise R&D expenditure, number of R&D Global Centers, Integrated Product Development (IPD) team, team of R&D professionals, evaluation of molecules in number, number of clinical trials, etc. and output comprises new product launches across geographies, number of patents, number of DMFs, number of ANDAs and NDAs, and number of successfully completed trials. Intellectual Capital enables pharmaceutical companies to bring innovative healthcare solutions to the end-user and in pushing the frontiers of innovation.

Investors' Wealth Surges by Rs 128 Lakh Cr In Samvat 2080, Gold Gives 32 Pc Return

MUMBAI: As the Indian stock market ended Samvat year 2080, investors' wealth surged by a whopping Rs 128 lakh crore (about \$1.5 trillion at current exchange rate) to Rs 453 lakh crore in just one year.

This made Samvat 2080 the biggest wealth-creating year on record, banking upon a stable government, strong fundamentals and record inflows by domestic funds which was at Rs 4.7 lakh crore.

The National Stock Exchange (NSE) saw its investor base crossing 20 crore. Amid strong interest from retail investors, 336 companies made their stock market debuts in Samvat 2080 — with 248 coming from the SME segment.

Nearly 100 of these IPOs have launched with listing gains exceeding 50 per cent and 163 IPOs are currently trading above their issue prices, as per industry data.



Samvat 2080 also saw significant growth in the prices of gold and silver, with both precious metals delivering returns of 32 per cent and 39 per cent, respectively. This can be attributed to three key global factors — geopolitical tensions, US presidential election and global interest rate policy.

The mutual fund sector saw its total assets at about Rs 68 lakh crore, with systematic investment plan

(SIP) investments nearing Rs 25,000-crore mark.

The new Samvat or Hindu New Year begins at the time of Diwali. During this time, many investors believe that trades made during Muhurat draw prosperity for the year ahead.

According to market experts, with Nifty returning 25 per cent and Nifty 500 returning 30 per cent in Samvat 2080, investors should be happy.

But the 6.2 per cent correction in October, the first above 5 per cent correction in 54 months, has triggered anxiety over the market performance, going forward.

Of serious concern is the relentless FII selling in October amounting to Rs 113,858 crore through the exchanges.

Given India's elevated valuations and concerns over deceleration in earnings growth, FII selling might continue, impacting the benchmark indices. In such a scenario investors should focus on stock-specific investment where Q2 results have been good and earnings visibility is bright, said experts.

Jateen Trivedi from LKP Securities said the US election next week is expected to be a decisive factor for gold's trend, with market participants closely watching its outcome for further direction.

BharatPe Launches Digital Gold Investment Platform, Expands Financial Services Portfolio

NEW DELHI: In a significant expansion of its financial services offerings, Delhi-based fintech BharatPe unveiled its new investment platform, Invest BharatPe, on Monday.

The platform's inaugural product allows customers to invest in digital gold through a partnership with Safegold.

The launch strategically coincides with India's festive season, when gold investments traditionally peak.

"The investment platform aligns with our objective of driving financial inclusion for the underserved across the country," said BharatPe CEO Nalin Negi. "With many consumers planning gold investments during the festive season, this is the perfect timing for our new offering."

The platform will also incorporate BharatPe's lending initiative, 12 per cent Club, though this comes amid recent regula-



tory changes. The Reserve Bank of India's tightened guidelines around peer-to-peer lending have temporarily halted new customer onboarding for the service.

BharatPe has been actively diversifying its product portfolio. In August, the company introduced secured credit products, including two-wheeler loans and loans against mutual funds, partnering with lenders like OTO Capital and Volt Money.

This followed its 2022 en-

try into the gold loans segment, where it offers merchants loans up to Rs 20 lakh against gold collateral through NBFC partnerships.

The company's financial health shows signs of improvement, with consolidated EBITDA losses narrowing significantly from Rs 826 crore in FY23 to Rs 209 crore in FY24.

Cash burn has been reduced by 85 per cent year-over-year, while the merchant lending portfolio grew by 40 per cent compared to the previous year.

This latest move reinforces BharatPe's strategy to become a comprehensive financial services provider, particularly focusing on India's underserved segments.

Govt Considers Hybrid Instruments for Foreign Investment



NEWDELHI: The government is evaluating measures to enhance flexibility for strategic foreign investors in acquiring stakes in domestic companies, following a decline in offshore investment to a five-year low, according to three sources familiar with the matter.

Under consideration is a proposal to permit foreign investments through hybrid instruments combining equity and debt, a departure from current regulations. This potential policy shift represents a significant step toward further liberalisation of India's capital market and foreign capital flows, which currently face various restrictions due to the partial convertibility of the Indian currency.

These hybrid instruments, known as 'mezzanine instruments' in financial circles, are widely used globally, particularly in major mergers and acquisitions. However, India's existing foreign exchange laws do not recognise such financing tools, limiting investment options for foreign entities interested in the Indian market. The initiative comes as India's Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) figures show concerning trends. Gross FDI, including reinvested earnings and equity inflows, dropped to USD 71 billion in 2023-24, marking the lowest level since 2018-19, compared to USD 71.4 billion in 2022-23 and USD 84.8 billion in 2021-22, as reported by the Reserve Bank of India. The country's share of global FDI decreased from a peak of 6.5 per cent in 2020 to 2.1 per cent in 2023.

Internal government estimates suggest the proposed reforms could attract additional foreign inflows of USD 20-30 billion into the South Asian economy. The federal finance ministry is reportedly supportive of these changes, though the proposal remains under discussion. This aligns with Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's recent statement that India requires USD 100 billion in annual FDI to meet its investment needs, up from the current USD 70-80 billion.

Current regulations restrict companies to raising either equity or compulsorily convertible securities under FDI rules, with sector-specific caps in areas such as banking and defence. While separate rules govern foreign debt financing, these impose limitations on both the cost and utilisation of loans and bonds raised from overseas sources.

Govt Spending Curbs and Tax Growth Keep India's Fiscal Deficit in Check



NEW DELHI: The Indian government has maintained strict control over its fiscal deficit, reaching only 29 per cent of the Budget Estimate during April-September 2024, according to data released Wednesday by the Controller General of Accounts (CGA). This notable restraint is primarily attributed to election-related spending restrictions and robust tax collection growth. The fiscal deficit target for the current financial year was set at Rs 16.13 lakh crore, equivalent to 4.9 per cent of GDP, as outlined in the July Budget. Financial analysts suggest that based on current trends, the final deficit figure could potentially fall below the initial Budget Estimate. The possibility of a downward revision in capital expenditure for the full fiscal year could further contribute to a lower-than-projected deficit. Net tax receipts for the first half of the fiscal year reached Rs 12.65 lakh crore, accounting for 49 per cent of the annual target, while total government expenditure stood at Rs 21.1 lakh crore, representing 44 per cent of the yearly goal. Capital expenditure, which focuses on physical infrastructure development, amounted to Rs 4.15 lakh crore, achieving 37 per cent of the annual target. The reduced government spending is largely attributed to the general elections period.

RBI Extends Prompt Corrective Action Framework to Govt-Owned NBFCs

MUMBAI: In a significant regulatory move, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced Tuesday that it will extend its Prompt Corrective Action (PCA) framework to government-owned Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs), excluding those in the Base Layer.

This policy shift, set to take effect on October 1, 2024, will apply to NBFCs based on their audited financials as of March 31, 2024, or thereafter. This measure aligns with the RBI's continued effort to bolster supervision within the broader financial sector.

The PCA framework, initially implemented for private NBFCs in October 2022, is designed to ensure early regulatory intervention for financial institutions facing difficulties, thereby safeguarding their financial health.

Extending it to government-owned NBFCs, such as Power Finance Corporation (PFC), REC, Indian Railway Finance Corporation (IRFC), and IFCI, reflects a broader attempt by the central bank to maintain stability in entities with significant ties to other financial segments.

Government-owned NBFCs play a critical role in the infrastructure finance landscape, often engaging in extensive lending to large-scale projects.

However, their size and systemic interconnectedness make them susceptible to sectoral risks, prompting RBI's decision to bring them under closer supervision.

Under the PCA framework, NBFCs that exhibit financial vulnerabilities may face restrictions on various operational fronts. These include limitations on dividend distribution, remittance of profits, and actions like promoter equity infusions or increased leverage.

The RBI also intends to restrict these NBFCs from issuing guarantees or assuming contingent liabilities on behalf of group companies.

The RBI's directive aims to promote timely corrective measures within troubled financial institutions. Through the PCA framework, the central bank can intervene early to address issues, thus maintaining market discipline and ensuring corrective measures are implemented proactively.

In addition to fostering financial stability, this oversight tool enables the RBI to take additional actions as needed, reinforcing accountability across the sector.

According to the RBI's statement, the extension of the PCA framework serves as both a safeguard for NBFCs' financial health and a mechanism to enhance market discipline.

This proactive approach underscores the RBI's commitment to a resilient financial ecosystem and follows a series of regulatory measures introduced over recent years to strengthen the NBFC sector.

As the October 2024 deadline approaches, government-owned NBFCs will be expected to align with the new framework requirements, ensuring they maintain the robust financial parameters essential for long-term stability.

India Inc. Reports Slowest Revenue Growth in Four Years: CRISIL Analysis

NEW DELHI: Corporate India witnessed its most sluggish revenue growth in 16 quarters during July-September 2024, with overall growth moderating to 5-7 per cent, according to CRISIL Market Intelligence and Analytics.

The slowdown was primarily attributed to weak performance in construction and industrial commodities sectors.

While construction and industrial commodities segments recorded a mere 1 per cent growth, consumer-focused sectors demonstrated resilience.

Despite the revenue deceleration, corporate profitabil-



ity remained strong. The analysis indicates that aggregate EBITDA grew by about 10 per cent in the second quarter of fiscal year 2025, with EBITDA margins estimated at 21-21.5 per cent.

The export segment, accounting for roughly 22 per cent of the sample, managed a modest 5 per cent growth.

"Among the top 10 sectors, which account for 75 per cent of revenue, eight saw EBITDA margin expansion, led by export-linked sectors such as IT services and pharmaceuticals, investment-linked sectors such

as power, and consumer discretionary sectors such as automotive and telecom services," explained Elizabeth Master, Associate Director-Research, CRISIL Market Intelligence and Analytics.

"The two sectors that faced margin contraction were steel, due to higher iron ore prices, and cement, due to subdued pricing," she added.

Looking ahead, CRISIL projects further improvement in margins by 50-150 basis points over fiscal 2025, supported by easing commodity prices and anticipated volume-based revenue growth.

Artificial Intelligence's promises & limitations in Banking

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has become a well-known term today, and its role in society is expanding rapidly. This growth has led to a broader public understanding of AI. Currently, AI is widely applied in fields such as video and voice editing, and it also enhances personal productivity with tools like ChatGPT. Furthermore, large corporations and industries increasingly depend on AI-generated economic analyses to gain competitive advantage in decision-making processes. As a result, discussions are emerging about the reliability and usefulness of these AI-driven insights.

A recent warning from RBI Governor Shashikant Das Gupta to the Indian banking sector that an over-reliance on AI might create new hazards and impede the nation's economic development brought the subject greater attention. According to a survey, by 2024, about 58 per cent of banks will have used AI in some capacity, and by the following year, that percentage is predicted to hit 77%. Almost the whole banking system may rely on AI for analysis and evaluation in the coming year or two.

The increasing reliance of banks on this latest technology is driven by specific commercial objectives. AI has the potential to achieve these



objectives through meaningful results. For example, banks and other financial institutions have always had access to a variety of data, but analysis of that data has traditionally relied on human labor, which has not always been sufficient for gaining competitive advantages on a local or global level. In the context of the Indian economy, for instance, the general public is still hesitant about investing in the capital market and stock market, as they have yet to establish a credible understanding of the risk-return analysis. AI presents potential solutions to these issues in the future.

Even after nearly eight decades of independence, a significant portion of the population is still not integrated into the banking system. Although there was considerable progress during the Modi government's first term through the Jan Dhan scheme, the objective of financial inclusion is still not fully achieved in Indian

society. Through AI, banks and financial institutions can identify which segments of society remain excluded from banking services. Using AI, banks could develop specific financial schemes tailored to marginalized families, small-scale farmers, and individuals employed in the unorganized sector, thus expanding the reach of the banking system to those in genuine need. This could also serve as an aid for poverty alleviation in the country while simultaneously increasing the profitability of banks. AI can also be utilized in banking to indirectly assess individuals' economic status, considering various financial behaviors of both men and women. It is worth noting that social media usage is widespread in Indian society, where nearly everyone expresses their desires, likes, and dislikes. By analyzing these preferences, banks can assess an individual's financial capability and subsequently offer various products and

services through financial schemes, aiming to enhance their profitability. Another major objective of AI use is to prevent fraud and financial scam. Years ago, it started with the misuse of ATM chips, which later extended to OTP-based scams resulting in unauthorized fund transfers from bank accounts. Today, Indian society faces this issue, and the banking system is concerned about it. Primarily, banks aim to use AI to prevent such financial frauds, ensuring financial security for the public and maintaining their trust. In the U.S., AI prevented approximately \$13 billion in financial fraud in 2023, a figure expected to reach \$40 billion by 2027, demonstrating AI's potential to curb cyber fraud in banking.

Despite these advantages, it is also a reality that AI is merely a tool, and its reliability depends on the credibility of the data it utilizes. Additionally, the type of evaluation and analysis desired by an individual or institution poses a limitation to AI's use. Due to this limitation, AI-generated analyses may at times be unreliable, ineffective, or biased. A few years ago, when a major global online company used AI to screen candidates, it found that none of the selected candidates were female. Investigation revealed that only data from past male hires had been fed into AI, which resulted in preference solely

for male applicants in the new selection. Following this, the company ceased using AI for hiring. Similar limitations exist in the financial sector, where AI uses standardized analyses to determine credit scores, giving a competitive advantage to those already favored by past analyses. Furthermore, it is common in banking that during economic booms, customer deposits are high, and banks freely provide loans since data-driven economic assessments are in favor of growth. However, during economic downturns, lending policies become restrictive, and individuals' creditworthiness is evaluated differently, making loans less accessible. Thus, it is evident that AI alone cannot achieve much on its own.

During the current Diwali festive season, an example can further illustrate the limitations of AI: people tend to shop enthusiastically for sweets, clothes, computers and technology, mobile phones, two-wheelers, and cars. If there's a decline in such purchases this Diwali compared to previous years, AI might prematurely conclude that the country is heading toward a recession, even though a recession is technically defined as negative GDP growth for three consecutive quarters.

The company's initial public offering (IPO), which concluded on October 24, 2024, garnered substantial investor interest with a 78.02-times subscrip-



tion rate. The offering, priced between Rs 56 to Rs 59 per share, comprised a fresh issue of 50,84,000 shares, resulting in the promoter and promoter group's shareholding reduction from 91.59 per cent to 67.09

per cent.

Prior to the public offering, United Heat Transfer successfully raised Rs 8.46 crore from anchor investors on October 21, 2024, allocating 14.34 lakh shares at Rs 380 per share to six anchor investors. The company plans to utilise the proceeds for loan repayment, working capital requirements, and general corporate purposes.

Prior to this round, Finova had raised approximately USD 125 million, with its last reported valuation at USD 376 million in March 2022, according to Tracxn data.

India-U.S. Ties: Comparing Trump and Harris on Key Issues

NEW YORK: As the U.S. election approaches, it's clear that Republican candidate Donald Trump and Democrat Kamala Harris have different records on India. Trump has a history of high-level engagements with India, while Harris, despite her Indian roots, has a limited track record, with statements on issues like Kashmir that have drawn attention.

Trump's Track Record with India Trump has previously built a strong rapport with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, celebrating their connection at public events in Houston and Ahmedabad. In his recent Diwali message, Trump emphasized his commitment to strengthening U.S.-India ties, praising Modi and expressing a desire to enhance their partnership if re-elected.



Statements In contrast, Harris's public remarks on India have been sparse, with a few statements on human rights in Kashmir, which created a stir early on. During her 2019 campaign, she advocated for intervention in Kashmir, a stance that has since softened as she assumed office, reflecting the realities of governing.

Cooperation Under both Trump and the Biden administration, the U.S. has seen India as a key player in countering China's influence in the Indo-Pacific. Trump revived the "Quad" alliance with India, Australia, and Japan to foster regional security, which Biden elevated further. Both candidates share common ground on defense cooperation, as seen in initiatives like GE

Aerospace's F414 engines, which align with India's "Make in India" push for local manufacturing.

Challenges in Trade Relations Trade is likely to be an area of tension. Trump has previously criticized India's tariffs on U.S. products, singling out specific goods like Harley-Davidson motorcycles. In a recent speech, he called India a "trade abuser," hinting at a stricter approach if re-elected. This may contrast with Biden's more nuanced approach, balancing trade concerns with diplomatic goals.

India-Russia Relations India's ties with Russia, particularly regarding energy purchases amid the Ukraine conflict, have raised U.S. concerns. While Biden's administration has largely tolerated India's position due to the China factor, Trump's potential stance is less certain but might offer India more flexibility.

Lawsuits filed to nullify Japan's general election over vote disparities

TOKYO: Lawyers filed lawsuits at several high courts in Japan on Monday seeking to nullify the results and conduct a rerun of the previous day's general election, local media reported.

The lawyers are set to complete filing the lawsuits with 14 high courts and their branches across the country later Monday, challenging all the 289 single-seat electoral district results, arguing that disparities in the weight of votes violated the principle of equality under the Constitution, reports Xinhua quoting Kyodo News.

Boundary changes and redistribution of single-seat constituencies for the latest lower house election resulted in the maximum vote weight disparity falling slightly from the previous such election in 2021 to 2.06-



fold, the report said. A revised law enacted in 2022 added 10 single-seat electoral districts to five prefectures and cut one each from 10 prefectures while redrawing boundaries in another 10 prefectures, affecting a total of 140 constituencies, it added.

The revision aimed at narrowing the vote disparity between the 2.0-fold level between

densely and sparsely populated districts within the country.

Large disparities in the weight of votes cast have led to numerous lawsuits claiming they violate the Constitution.

The Supreme Court said the maximum disparity of 2.08-fold in the 2021 lower house election was constitutional as parliament had made efforts to redress differences in the weight of votes.

Both Harris and Trump are actively rallying in these states. Harris will deliver a closing argument speech at the Ellipse near the US Capitol, highlighting her campaign's focus on engaging undecided voters and solidifying support. This comes as more than 48 million people have already participated in early voting or used postal ballots across the country, reflecting intense voter engagement in this pivotal election.

N-Korea Increases Security for Kim Jong-un amid Assassination Concerns

SEOUL: North Korea has intensified security measures around its leader, Kim Jong-un, due to the rising threat of an assassination attempt, according to South Korea's National Intelligence Service (NIS).

During a parliamentary audit session, South Korea's spy agency briefed lawmakers on heightened security protocols for Kim, as reported by Yonhap News Agency. This information was shared by Rep. Lee Seong-kweon of the ruling People Power Party and Rep. Park Sun-won of the main opposition Democratic Party.

The NIS revealed that North



Korea has introduced drone detection systems and communication-jamming vehicles to enhance Kim's safety. These upgrades coincide with a significant

rise in Kim's public appearances, totaling 110 engagements this year—an increase of 60% compared to the previous year. The agency further reported

that the secretive nation has abandoned its use of the "Juche" calendar—a year-numbering system honoring Kim Il-sung, the country's late founder. This move is seen as part of efforts to solidify Kim Jong-un's leadership as the nation's supreme authority.

Additionally, the NIS noted an apparent increase in the public role of Kim Ju-ae, Kim Jong-un's daughter. Her elevated status was emphasized by her public appearances, including an event where she was accompanied by Kim Yo-jong, the leader's influential sister.

Sri Sri Ravi Shankar honoured with Fiji's highest civilian award

Fiji has conferred its highest civilian honour upon Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, the global spiritual master and humanitarian leader, for his tireless contribution to the upliftment of the human spirit and connecting diverse communities in peace and harmony.

Gurudev was given the title of 'Honourary Officer Of The Order of Fiji' by the President of the Republic of Fiji, Ratu Wiliame M. Katonivere.

Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, who received a traditional and grand welcome on arrival in Fiji on Saturday, also took to social media to share his happiness on being felicitated with the country's highest civilian award. "Honoured to receive Fiji's highest civilian award – the Honourary Officer of the Order of Fiji. I thank the President and the people of Fiji," he wrote on X. Fiji has become the sixth country to confer the highest civilian award upon Sri Sri Ravi



Shankar, recognising the vast scope of his humanitarian work globally through his 'The Art of Living Foundation'. 'The Art of Living Foundation' was set up by Sri Sri Ravi Shankar in 1981 with the purpose of spreading happiness and harmony through its multifarious service initiatives in areas of mental health, education, environment, women and youth empowerment, and stress relief and meditation programmes. Yesterday, the volunteer-based humanitarian and non-governmental organisation (NGO) has its centres operating in more than 180 countries.

UN Secretary-General Urges Ceasefire & Civilian Protection amid Escalating Conflict in Sudan

UNITED NATIONS: UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres has called for immediate efforts to cease hostilities and ensure the protection of civilians in war-torn Sudan.

However, he stated that current conditions are not favorable for the deployment

of a UN force to safeguard civilians.

"Eighteen months have passed since brutal fighting erupted between the Sudanese Armed Forces and the Rapid Support Forces," Guterres told the UN Security Council on Monday. "The suffering is



growing, with nearly 25 mil-

lion people now in need of humanitarian assistance."

Guterres described the crisis as a nightmare of violence for the people of Sudan, with thousands of civilians killed and many others subjected to horrific atrocities, including rape and sexual assaults.

AMERICAN POLITICS AT ITS LOWEST

American Politics at Its Lowest

With the rise of ugly racial propaganda, the narrow social issues, on the eve of the presidential election, American ideals have just not only been compromised, but the American dream is shattered, if not buried.

It might have been quite a delight for the supporters of the Democratic Party nominee, Kamala Harris, when a few of the allies of the Republican Party nominee and a former President, Donald Trump were seen indulging in racial propaganda at the recently held rally in New York. They were not only undermining the ideals of the world's most powerful country loved and admired for being a symbol of all-inclusive plural society.

There have been whispers, perhaps, loud enough, in the political corridors during the past few months i.e. soon after the announcement of the candidature of Kamala Harris as the Democratic Party nominee about her racial identity. She is a daughter of a pretty highly intelligent Indian mother and her father, Donald Jasper Harris of Jamaican origin, a well-known economist and professor of Stanford University. Kamala is also a well-known lawyer.

The irresponsible observations against Kamala Harris ridiculing her being a non-white is going to resonate with the country's fragile social fabric.

The ongoing presidential poll in the US has evoked

worldwide attention. There is a general impression that if Trump is back in the White House, he would be initiating a peace process for ending the Russia-Ukraine War. The Trump Administration might also end the conflict between Israel and the terrorists, who have dared to invade Israel.

There is a general impression that Trump and Kamala represent two diametrically opposite viewpoints regarding peace and economy.

Trump claims that he would not hesitate to talk to Russian President Vladimir Putin to end the War in Eastern Europe, on the other hand, Kamala says that the US has to support the cause of democracy by helping the Ukrainians facing invasion from their powerful neighbor. Interestingly, none among them is even mentioning how the American deep state and proxies have successfully created differences among the Ukrainians and Russians having common faith i.e. Orthodox Church, and also bound by common heritage.

In the highly competitive geo-politics, none can be identified as innocent. The war games are being played for some known as well as for some unknown purposes.

It cannot be deleted that the biggest beneficiaries of the ongoing War in Eastern Europe is the American war industry. A substantial amount of the financial and military assistance to Ukraine is being plowed back to America's industrial-military establishment.

The Past Animosity

Anyway, the US voters are not electing a President, but are also deciding the direction of the geo-politics, whether 2025 will be witnessing more conflicts or an era of peace. In this context, the poll is being watched across the continents.

Greed and Peace

The presidential poll is going to be a decisive battle for peace or the continuation of conflicts, and perhaps for the Americans, whether they would like to be depending upon the current system of unemployment allowances or would be voting for generating economy and wealth by toiling themselves. The choices are either to be depending upon charity of the state as an unemployment allowance and indulge in drug addiction etc.

At present the leading American companies are getting their finished products being manufactured in China. In other words, the defunct Industries in America might be revived, if Trump returns to power.

Meanwhile, Kamala Harris like her predecessor, Joe Biden too continues to be a favorite of the American armament industries as well the companies getting their products manufactured in China. She was fielded just a few weeks before the poll following the decision of Biden not to contest for the election. However,

with the poll campaign getting warmed up, she as the party's presidential nominee, appears to be distancing herself from her predecessor, if not her mentor, Joe Biden. Admitting that her Administration would not be a replica of the Biden Administration, she told a media channel during a recently held debate that if elected, her Administration would not be an extension of the Biden policies, but she would be taking steps for reducing the cost of living for the common people. She also promised to announce 15 US dollars per hour wage, but she did not elaborate what steps she would be taking for the job creations during her forthcoming innings in the White House, if elected

The Chaotic Retreat

There is a general impression that under Joe Biden, the US decision to suddenly withdraw from Afghanistan was just humiliating for the world's most powerful country. Also, he did little to end the avoidable fratricide i.e. the Ukraine -Russia War in Eastern Europe, and could have tried to diffuse the ongoing conflict in West Asia. It might be just a partial truth. The US Secretary of State, Antony Blinken has been making visits to West Asia to diffuse the conflict and is seen pleading for peace. The much awaited ceasefire might be announced anytime.

In spite of these efforts, there is a general impression that the Joe Biden Administration has been working to serve the vast business interests of the American military Industries and the American taxpayers have to

cough up the huge costs of the ongoing conflicts from Eastern Europe to West Asia. The financial and military support to Ukraine has been befitting only a section of the American Industries i.e. the armament manufacturers.

Apart from benefitting the country's military-industrial complex, there are allegations that the American deep state i.e. CIA and other institutions, including the media and judiciary, are not impartial in the ongoing poll. It is going to bruise the traditional image of the USA as a true democracy for a while, and may be in future too

Meanwhile, Donald Trump, who has recently escaped three attacks, has threatened that if voted to power, he would be de-classifying the files related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. It is believed that he was punished for taking steps to end the cold war after diffusing the Cuban Crisis. The decision of R.F. Kennedy junior, a nephew of the slain president could be a good support for Trump. The promise of Trump to declassify the files might also reveal some embarrassing dimensions of the American state, especially its deep state.

The Challenge

The 2024 presidential poll is not just a fight between two political parties, but in this poll, the crucial roles of the military-industrial complex and the Deep State i.e. the CIA cannot be denied. It is believed that Trump's decision to withdraw the American troops from Afghanistan has not been taken kindly by the war industries of America.

President Joe Biden's decision to extend financial and military support to Ukraine has helped the weapon manufacturers in the US. Similarly, the American policies in West Asia didn't contribute to any peace effort. The apathy of the White House towards peace has helped at least the investors, who had purchased shares in companies manufacturing weapons. The prices of

their shares have skyrocketed in recent years.

It is also being observed that President Biden's policies towards China lacked any long-term vision. It did not lead to any substantial programme to revive the manufacturing industries in the US. The US companies continue to use China as a manufacturing hub for their products. They are reaping huge profits, but hardly any jobs for the people.

The 2024 presidential election is also witnessing a difficult campaign characterized by political scheming and intense scrutiny. Trump's agenda cannot be called a walkover paving any easy option to reclaim the White House following his 2021 exit.

Another interesting feature in this election is the support the industrialist, Elon Musk is extending to Trump. It has caused worries among the supporters of the Democratic Party. A

California resident, Aaron Greenspan, in a lawsuit has accused Musk of violating state laws and the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) Act. In a recent emergency motion, Greenspan, who founded the company PlainSite, said Musk's newly announced million-dollar giveaways to voters in swing states violated federal law that prohibits paying or offering to pay people to either register to vote or vote.

Musk's lawyers noted that the giveaways were only open to people who signed a petition in favor of free speech and the right to bear arms and that the petition itself says it is only open to registered voters in swing states such as Pennsylvania and Wisconsin.

The bitter campaigning and the play of forces in the election is going to have worldwide impact.

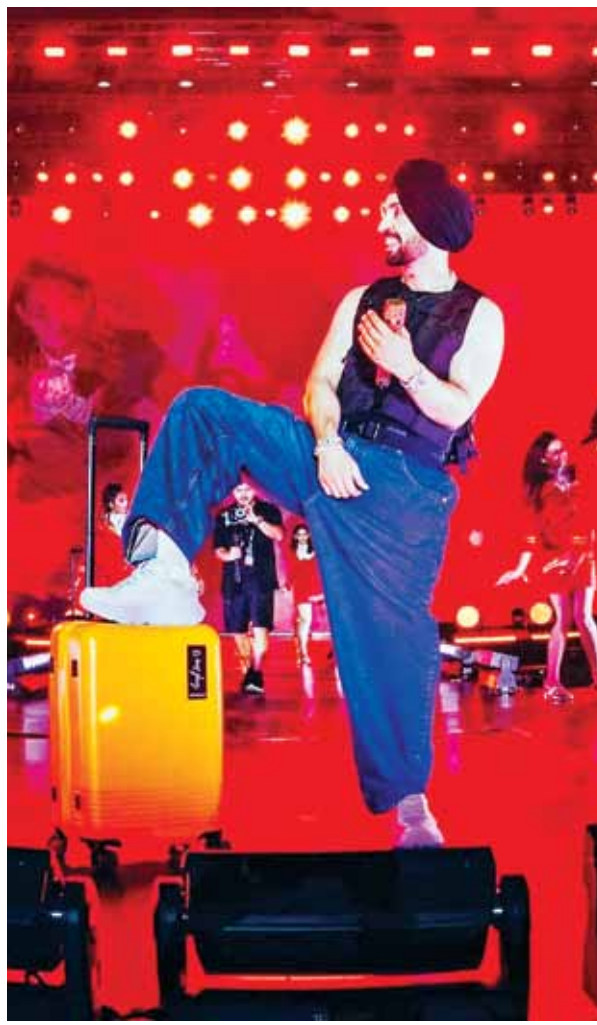

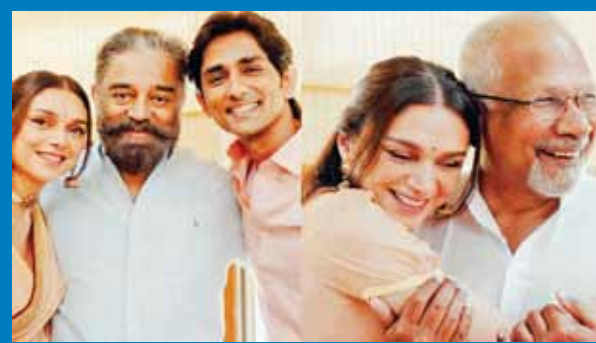

Economic Pandora's box of distressed Indian MSMEs

An economic "Pandora's Box" is likely to open up in India following the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) Borrowers Association highlighting the condition of MSME borrowers in India, who constitute 90% of entrepreneurs in the country but are facing a "distressing" future.

The National MSME Borrowers Association, in a press conference recently at the Mumbai Press Club, focused on the "failure of the authorities — particularly the RBI, Banks and financial institutions — to give effect to a notification dated 29-5-2015 under Section 9 of the MSMED Act." "The MSMED Act and the Notification was enacted taking note of the fact that MSMEs are the backbone of the Indian economy, particularly in generation of employment and creation — and equitable distribution — of wealth," according to a MSMEBA release. "The notification is mandatory. Not a single MSME was left unaffected during the COVID-19 period and many suffered huge losses that hampered their bank loan repayments," said Advocate Mathews J. Nedumpara, who has been fighting for the rights of the MSMEs and had obtained a Supreme Court judgement (M/s. PRO KNITS versus Board of Directors of Canara Bank) in their favour.

"However, despite the Supreme Court judgement, the MSMEs still face threat of dis- possession from their homes and enterprises because of reluctance to give effect to this judgement, and thus benefiting the ARCs and those who do business in buying the assets of MSMEs in stress," he said.



Alleging that ARCs and vested interests "have become billionaire overnight by acquiring the properties of affected MSMEs through crafty means," Nedumpara said that gross failure on the part of the RBI and the Regulator to implement the Notification — and even the nationalized banks' board of directors not constituting a Committee in this regard — "cannot be an innocent failure." Chartered accountant Manisha Mehta, President, MSME-BA, who is one of the affected MSMEs, described how she ran from pillar to post to get justice. "I founded in 1996 Perfect Infraengineers, that was listed by 2015 on the NSE MSME platform with 300 employees for manufacturing an award-winning, eco-friendly, energy-saving product."

However, problems like bank overcharging interest rate, COVID-19 lockdown and moratorium made her seek financial aid under the new ECLGS scheme for MSMEs. Then, on July 20, 2020 her bank claimed that her company was an NPA — rendering it ineligible for aid and has since then frozen all her current accounts, while illegally possess-

ing and attempting to sell her immovable properties under the SARFESAI Act, she claimed. Mehta said that the MSMEBA would be conducting a nationwide public campaign to highlight the "injustice" caused to MSMEs, the violation of their rights and the need for MSMEs to be informed of their rights while also being vigilant and fighting in unity for this.

"The MSMEs, which today includes the trading and service sectors, involves the lives and livelihoods of millions of Indian families. These small-time entrepreneurs face great difficulty to avail credit facilities even from nationalized banks." "The Government of India — while keeping in mind that this vital priority sector should not perish but grow robustly — made it mandatory for banks and financial institutions to reach out to MSMEs and extend credit facilities even without collateral securities."

"Likewise, those who purchase goods from MSMEs and fail to pay them on time are mandated to pay interest at three times the bank rate. The monies due to the MSMEs can be recovered as though a public debt through

revenue recovery proceedings." Lamenting that "all this is only on paper," Mehta said the notification dated 29-5-2015 "prohibits the bank from classifying the MSME account as NPA, and also initiating recovery steps without constituting a committee." Noting that not a single bank or financial institution — including the SBI — has ever constituted a committee or made any attempt towards resolution of the stress, she said that for the last 10 years, "recovery action is being initiated by throwing the notification into the bin."

"Thousands of MSMEs were brought to total ruin with forcible possession being taken of their establishments, factories and homes, and when they knock on the doors of courts — the NCLT, DRT, High Court and Supreme Court — relief is declined for reasons difficult to fathom."

The MSMEBA stated that though India has the largest workforce in the world with about 80 crores people aged between 20 to 60, majority of them are unemployed or under-employed — where India faces the largest problem of unemployment — and highlights the

need for building a +robust+ MSME sector.

The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Government of India, vide their Gazette Notification dated May 29, 2015, had notified a "Framework for Revival and Rehabilitation of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, to provide a simpler and faster mechanism to address the stress in the accounts of MSMEs and to facilitate the promotion and development of MSMEs.

The Reserve Bank was advised to issue necessary instructions to banks for effective implementation and monitoring of this Framework.

After carrying out certain changes in the captioned Framework in consultation with the Indian Government, Ministry of MSME, so as to make it compatible with the existing regulatory guidelines on 'Income Recognition, Asset Classification and provisioning pertaining to Advances' issued to banks by RBI, the guidelines on the captioned Framework along with operating instructions were issued to banks on March 17, 2016.

The Revival and rehabilitation of MSME units having loan limits upto Rs 25 crore would be undertaken under this Framework. Banks were required to put into place their own Board-approved policy to operationalize the Framework not later than June 30, 2016.

The revised Framework superseded earlier guidelines on Rehabilitation of Sick Micro and Small Enterprises issued vide circular RPCD. CO-> MSME & NFS.BC.40/06.02.31/2012-2013 date November 1, 2012, except those relating to Reliefs and Concessions for Rehabilitation of Potentially Viable Units and One Time Settlement, mentioned in the said circular.
