NEW DELHI: Delhi Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena on Friday approved relaxation in qualifications for recruitment of victims of the 1984 Sikh riots to the post of multitasking staff (MTS), Raj Niwas said in a statement.

With the L-G's approval, the minimum educational qualification for the post of MTS has been relaxed from Class 10 to Class 8, making a larger number of candidates eligible for job, it said.

GST records second-highest collection at Rs 1.87 lakh cr in Oct EY Tax Partner Saurabh

NEW DELHI: Gross GST collection in October rose 9 per cent to over Rs 1.87 lakh crore, the second-highest ever, on pick-up in domestic sales and improved compliance.

The Central GST collection stood at Rs 33,821 crore, State GST at Rs 41,864 crore, Integrated GST at Rs 99,111 crore and cess at Rs 12.550 crore during the month.

As per the government data released on Friday, the total gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue grew 8.9 per cent to Rs 1,87,346 crore. In October 2023, the mop-up was at Rs 1.72 lakh crore.

October 2024 recorded the econd-best GST mop-up. The highest ever collection was in April 2024 at over Rs 2.1 lakh

During the month under review, GST from domestic transactions grew 10.6 per cent to Rs 1.42 lakh crore, while revenues from tax on imports rose about 4 per cent to Rs 45,096 crore.

Delhi Fire Services receives 318 fire related calls on Diwali, highest in 13 yrs

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Fire Services (DFS) experienced a surge in fire-related calls this Diwali with more than 300 such incidents reported across the city, which is the highest in the past 13 years, an official said on Friday

According to officials, the increase is attributed to the extensive use of firecrackers.

"The figure marks the highest number of Diwali-related fire and emergency incidents in the past 13 years," DFS chief Atul Garg said. DFS, which had ramped up its readiness for the festival by deploying fire engines and personnel across the city, reported that most calls were received between 5 pm on October 31 and 5 am on November 1.

According to the data shared by DFS, they had received 206 fire-related calls in 2011, 184 in 2012, 177 in 2013, 211 in 2014, 290 in 2015, 243 in 2016, 204 in 2017, 271 in 2018, 245 in 2019, 205 in 2020, 152 in 2021, 201 in 2022 and 208 in 2023.

"This year, we received 318 fire-related calls. The number is the highest in the last 13 years. "We were also fully prepared to tackle any and every situation

He said at least 78 calls regarding fire incidents were received between 4 pm and 9 pm. He said the peak time of such calls this year was 6 pm to 11.59 pm, when DFS received 176 fire-related calls, and from 12 am to 6 am, when received 144 calls. "Last year during the same time, we had received 195 fire-related calls," he added.

The relentless bursting of firecrackers through the night blanketed Delhi in dense smoke, causing severe noise pollution and reducing visibility as residents defied the ban

ficial of DFS said they received three calls of fatal nature.

Two calls were received from the Sagarpur area and one was received from the Daryaganj area. According to the southwest district police, they received two different calls regarding suicide at the Sagarpur police station. In the first call, a 44-year-old man, identified as Madanlal, committed suicide near Air India Colony. "His body was found in an auto-rickshaw. He was addicted to alcohol and used to work as a labourer. "No foul play behind the matter was suspected," a senior police officer said. He further said another call was also regarding suicide, this time by a 22-year-old man. "Another PCR call regarding suicide was received at 7.16 pm saying a man committed suicide by hanging himself in his house. The deceased was identified as Tushar. said the officer. He said a suicide note was also found which did not blame anyone behind his step, the officer said. A police officer of central district said they received a call regarding the death of a 52-year-old man in a house in the Daryaganj area.

the national Capital.

"Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann had claimed that if the Aam Aadmi Party came to power in Punjab, stubble burning would be stopped. However, the situation has become more dire. On October 26 alone, there were 360 cropburning incidents, with 108 of these coming from Punjab,

Bansuri Swaraj told to media. Hitting out at the Punjab government for inaction, Swaraj said, "He declined to meet us. Neither did he meet us nor did the Resident Com-

"If he's unwilling to engage in a dialogue, how can we address this pressing issue?" Swaraj questioned. Swaraj went on to express

her frustration with the Punjab government's ineffective handling of the crop residue burning issue, "How much longer must the people of Delhi suffer due to Punjab government's inefficiency? The AAP governs both Delhi and Punjab. Why can't these two states coordinate to control the burning of crop remains?

Delhi is one of the world's most polluted cities throughout the year. But its air turns toxic especially in winter due to several factors, including burning of crop residue, low wind speed, and bursting of firecrackers during festivals and increased moisture in the air. The pollution causes severe health issues for its residents every year.

The Air Quality Index (AQI) hovered around 250 to 300 in the entire last week as most parts of Delhi-NCR recorded very poor' air quality.

EC's goal is to strip itself of the last vestiges of neutrality: Congress slams poll body



NEW DELHI: After the Election Commission of India (ECI) rejected the Congress' allegations of irregularities in the recent Haryana Assembly elections, calling the claims of EVM tampering "baseless", Congress General Secretary Jairam Ramesh on Friday came up with the grand old party's counter-response to the poll body alleging that its goal is to strip itself of the last vestiges of neutrality.

Sharing a letter written by the party on X, Ramesh said: The ECI gave a non-reply to Congress' specific complaints in 20 Vidhan Sabha constituencies in Haryana. Here is the INC's esponse to this non-reply.'

Ramesh said that the ECI has not replied to its specific problem, rather it has given a generic answer to its complaints. "The answer given to the question of the machines' fluctuating batteries seeks to confuse rather than clarify. At any rate, the ECI reply is nothing more than a standard and generic set of bullets on how the machines function rather than a specific clarification on specific complaints. While our complaints were specific, the ECI response is generic and focused on diminishing the complaints and the petitioners, "Ramesh said in a post on X on Friday. The poll body had also asked Congress and other political parties to avoid raising "frivolous and unfounded doubts". On this, the letter said: "If we were bad faith actors, then we would never engage with the ECI to begin with. We would not painstakingly document our grievances and present them with egal precedents and arguments. Instead, we would focus on naming and shaming the Commission with examples from the ECI's own recent history which do not shroud it with glory... We would point out how the ECI never published a dissent note, actively suppressing it instead, by a former Commissioner in this regard. We would point out that the ECI has almost always fought any move for transparency and an increase in VVPAT verification numbers, with the same having to be ordered by the Supreme Court. This initiative aims to collect comprehensive data on 219 indigenous breeds across 16 species, involving approximately 100,000 field officials, primarily veterinarians and para-veterinarians, in the enumeration process. Addressing the launch event, Singh stressed the importance of conducting the census with "full honesty and sincerity," urging ministry officials to monitor the operation closely.

The data gathered is expected to aid in developing strategies to improve animal health, control diseases, and enhance breed improvement

Notably, Singh pointed out that despite India being the world's largest milk producer, it has struggled to export dairy



In conjunction with the census, Singh also announced the establishment of a USD 25 million 'Pandemic Fund Project' aimed at bolstering animal health security in India for better pandemic preparedness and response. often lead to human pandemics. Kant emphasized that animal diseases can devastate the livestock industry, a vital income source for millions of Indian

It will capture detailed data on 15 livestock species, including cattle, buffalo, sheep, goats, pigs, and more, alongside poultry counts from various households and institutions.

The previous census took place in 2019, and the latest iteration will leverage mobile

Ministers of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, and Dairying, S P Singh Baghel and George Kurian, also attended Baghel commended the de-

partment's preparation efforts for the census, while Kurian noted the livestock sector's significant contribution to the GDP and employment, particularly in rural areas.

As India embarks on this essential census, the collective goal remains clear: to secure the future of the nation's livestock sector, ensuring better health and productivity for the benefit of farmers and consumers alike.

'Mediocre' India outlook merits policy attention

he recent World Economic

Outlook from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) offers both encouraging news and warnings for the global economy. While a much-feared global recession has been averted and inflation is moderating, challenges persist, particularly with food prices and high services inflation in emerging economies. In the short term, the global growth outlook remains stable, with the U.S. outperforming initial growth projections for 2023, offsetting slower growth in some European nations. Although economic strains are visible in regions like West Asia, sub-Saharan Africa, and Central Asia due to conflicts, emerging Asian economies, notably China and India, are bolstered by public investments, mitigating the overall impact. For India, the IMF forecasts steady growth at 7 per cent for 2024-25, slightly moderating to 6.5 per cent in subsequent years. The report links this softening to the gradual exhaustion of the "pent-up demand" that fueled the post-pandemic rebound. This trend is evident in declining sales of cars and consumer goods, particularly in urban centres. However, a robust monsoon and improving rural incomes could potentially strengthen demand in the near term, though these factors are not guaranteed to sustain momentum. A longer-term concern raised by the IMF is the global growth forecast of a "mediocre" 3.1 per cent over the next five years, marking a decline from pre-pandemic trends. Amid rising protectionist policies, India's economic trajectory may increasingly rely on domestic demand. To capitalise on this, both central and state policymakers must focus on accelerating reforms. The IMF has recommended making India more accessible to global trade and investment by reducing import tariffs and FDI restrictions, alongside "ambitious" domestic reforms to boost competition and private investments. For India, these measures could be important in sustaining growth amid an increasingly uncertain global economic landscape.



Solar empowers women



coal, oil, gas, nuclear, and hydropower, which

require extensive infrastructure and intermedi-

ary transmission lines, solar energy can now be harnessed directly at its point of use — in

homes. It is now a home product. Decentralisation of power generation has significant implications for both environmental sustainability and societal structures. The ability to generate energy close to where it is consumed unlocks a cascade of benefits beyond mere convenience. Socially, economically, and developmentally, solar places power-literally

and figuratively — into the hands of individuals and communities, breaking down barriers that have long excluded them from the energy economy. This shift empowers people, particularly women, making them direct participants in the economy and catalysts for change. Women often bear the brunt of poor energy access, impacting their health, safety, and economic potential. Solar addresses this.

In Gujarat's Little Rann of Kutch, women salt farmers have transitioned from expensive diesel to solar pumps, boosting their income by 94% and reducing CO2 emissions by up to 1,15,000 metric tons annually. Initiatives such as the Barefoot College (India), the Grameen Shakti (Bangladesh), and Solar Sister (Africa) empower women to become solar engineers, benefiting millions and improving community health and safety. For example, We Care Solar's suitcases reduced perinatal deaths by 72% in Uganda's health centres.



Solar, especially through localised solutions, is advancing women's financial inclusion and enabling income generation directed towards education, health care, and other essential activities. By integrating women across the value chain — from end-users to entrepreneurs - solar is driving societal progress and elevating the status of women. In fact, solar employs more women than any other energy sector. In 2022, the solar photovoltaic industry alone provided jobs to around 4.9 million people, with women accounting for 40% of the workforce. With India's ambitious renewable targets, the sector is expected to create three million new jobs by 2030, offering significant opportunities for women if the current trends hold. No other energy project comes close to this potential.

Solar also uplifts marginalised communities Unlike coal, which has impoverished resourcerich regions, solar offers a sustainable path forward. India's coal mining districts exemplify the 'resource curse', where local communities suffer from poor health, education, and living conditions, with over 50% in poverty.

Distributed solar systems link energy produc-

well-being, driving climate resilience. Offgrid projects provide clean energy to areas without traditional electricity, supporting economic development in rural regions. Rooftop installations and mini-grids offer scalable, eco-friendly solutions, creating local jobs without the environmental impact of large-scale projects. Effective commu-

nity engagement is crucial for the success of these projects. For instance, in India, formalised community institutions such as self-help groups, farmer-producer organisations, and panchayati raj institutions are integral to village infrastructure planning. Where formal structures are absent, rural energy committees can oversee mini-grid operations, encompassing everything from planning and installation to tariff determination and maintenance, which ensure that energy access is thorough and benefits the entire community.

As solar technology progresses, three challenges persist: geographical imbalance, with most investments concentrated in developed nations leaving developing countries, particularly Africa, lagging; sectoral imbalance is evident as large-scale solar farms receive the majority of funding while smaller, crucial applications such as solar pumps and cold storages are overlooked; manufacturing concentration in just two countries disrupts supply chains and inflates prices, a problem set to intensify with rising global demand. The challenge at the home level will be to ensure easy availability and affordability of solar. This will require robust government and market support.

The second is to focus on the life cycle of solar technologies, with an emphasis on recycling and circularity to manage waste. Establishing clear guidelines for processing solar photovoltaic materials is vital, ensuring that they contribute to sustainability rather than exacerbate waste issues. A robust framework should mandate producer responsibility and involve government and end-of-life management collaboration, fostering efficient recycling and encouraging recyclability. Additionally, exploring mobile recycling plants and implementing stringent waste management processes are crucial for enhancing the environmental and economic nealth of the solar sector.

Policies and gender

A just energy transition is more than a shift from fossil fuels to renewables. It is about ensuring that all communities, especially those historically sidelined, benefit from the change. For solar energy to truly empower communities, it must be inclusive and equitable, positioning women not just as beneficiaries but also as pivotal change agents. This necessitates a re-evaluation of energy policies through a gender lens.

Current national-level electricity access policies often lack this perspective, limiting their effectiveness in combating inequality. It is crucial for electrification initiatives to integrate with sectors such as agriculture, forestry, and rural development to form a holistic approach to energy access. This integration helps to dismantle the systemic barriers that disproportionately affect women, fostering a more inclusive energy economy. With this, we can ensure that solar supports environmental sustainability, drives socio-economic development, and becomes a true catalyst for a liveable planet.

LOKENDRA SHARMA & PRANAY KOTASTHANE EXPLORE HOW U.S. AND ISRAEL ACTIONS ARE SHIFTING SUPPLY CHAIN FOCUS

The shifting sands within global supply chains



lobal supply chains are at an inflection point. While the COVID-19 pandemic shifted the focus from efficiency (just in time) to resilience (just in case), two developments in September 2024 indicate that another shift is underway in how supply chains are envisioned and operationalised — this time towards security (just to be secure).

Moves by the U.S. and Israel's pager

On September 23, the United States Department of Commerce proposed rules which, if accepted "would prohibit the import or sale of certain connected vehicle systems designed, developed, manufactured, or supplied by entities with a sufficient nexus to the PRC or Russia". The proposed rules target both the software an with vehicle connectivity systems as well as automated driving systems. While the 100% tariffs on Chinese EVs announced by the U.S. earlier this year stemmed from competition concerns aimed at reducing their sale in the domestic market, the newly proposed rules, which stem from national security concerns, would effectively ban their sale in the U.S.

The U.S. case against Chinese connected car tech is that both hardware and software components in cars employing some form of external communication capabilities can be potentially misused. The idea is that cars with connected car tech are essentially mobile listening posts, and that malicious actors can use their cameras and sensors for espionage purposes. Worse, these cars may even be disabled or hijacked — especially those level 3 and above on the Society of Automotive Engineers' levels of driving automation. For



security hawks, handing over such control to a state with which you may be in a future conflict simply carries overwhelming risks.

If there was any strand of thought moderating the hawkish focus on supply chain security, that evaporated as the world came to rith the Israeli supply chain attack, or September 17-18, targeting pagers and walkietalkies used by Hezbollah in Lebanon. More than 30 people including children were killed while thousands were injured. The fallout was felt far and wide leaving everyone wondering about the state of advanced technologies used or embedded in products across industries when even basic old-fashioned devices could be made to explode.

While the U.S. proposed rules and the Israeli pager attack have reignited and amplified the supply chain security debate, it arguably began a few years ago when the U.S., Australia, Japan and even India effectively banned Huawei and other Chinese telecom players from participating in the 5G rollout for security considerations. The motivating fear was that China could install backdoors in the telecom infrastructure giving it the capability to surveil or sabotage the same.

Since then, supply chain security concerns have spread to other tech industries such as semiconductors

From efficiency to resilience to security

During the heydays of globalisation, especially from the 1980s till the 2010s, supply chains were configured to ensure maximum efficiency; that is, weaving

a complex supply chain for each product or service in a way that components were procured and assembled at various locations across the world based on cost and other considerations. These "just in time" supply chains were to some extent immune from as a central supply node in this arrangement. A combination of various factors in the late 2010s and early 2020s such as the U.S.-China rivalry and resultant technology decoupling and the COVID-19 pandemic shifted the focus away from "just in time" to "just in case".

That is, there was a recognition in the U.S., Europe, India and elsewhere that supply chains had become too dependent on Chinese exports. Supply chain resilience, as a result, became all the rage. But, almost simultaneously, security considerations around Chinese involvement in telecom infrastructure also led to another shift — from resilience to security. This shift has only solidified in the wake of Israel's supply chain attack

India and supply chain security

How can India ensure that its supply chains are secure? Extreme measures such as outright banning import of a range of tech products and services would not work. Neither would fully subscribing to the "just in case" strategy that focuses on supply chain resilience.

What can work is a two-pronged approach involving both "just to be secure" and "just in case" strategies. The "just to be secure" strategy can be put in motion through "trust but verify and "zero trust." Certain tech products and services (say those used in communications transport or critical infrastructure broadly defined) can be subjected to trust but verify entailing methods such as periodic audits, on-site inspections, and establishment of a mechanism that ensures compliance with national and international security standards. But a more narrowly defined set of technologies that are most critical (say those used by Indian military, intelligence agencies, or for cutting edge research and development) e subjected to zero trus ing by default that all tech products and services are compromised and applicable to friends and foes alike, zero trust would entail developing the most stringent checks during procurement as well as continuous monitoring and verification. For all the rest less critical technologies, the "just in case" strategy involving diversification of vendors and friendshoring would suffice in taking care of larger supply chain concerns about cascading fallouts due to single points of vulnerabilities and failures.

Crossing Boundaries: Book tells tales of Indian-Chinese relation

n Rebels, Traitors, Peacemakers, authors Shivaji Das and Yolanda Yu delve into a complex love story, one that transcends personal experiences to reflect on broader social and cultural implications of cross-cultural relationships. Through the lens of 32 Indian-Chinese couples, this powerful book explores the challenges and triumphs of navigating love across geographical, cultural, and political boundaries in an increasingly polarized world.


The authors, themselves a crosscultural couple—Shivaji from India and Yolanda from China—bring authenticity and sensitivity to the subject, having experienced firsthand the biases and stereotypes that often accompany such relationships. Their personal journey, marked by their Indian-Chinese marriage, provides the emotional core of the book. When they met and married, Shivaji and Yolanda found themselves confronting not just cultural stereotypes but also the rigid social codes of their respective societies. By sharing the lives of couples who face similar challenges, they hope to shed light on the real experiences of those who, despite obstacles, dare to love beyond borders.

The structure of *Rebels*, *Traitors*, Peacemakers is both simple and impactful, with each chapter focusing on one couple's unique journey. The book is easy to read, with a crisp, straightforward style that captures the essence of each story without unnecessary embellishment. Each chapter serves as a detailed portrait, delving into the couples' experiences, their weddings, and the discrimination they faced along the way. Notably, all but one story documents relationships between Indian men and Chinese women, reflecting the broader societal acceptance patterns within this dynamic.

The stories are presented with neutrality, allowing each couple's voice to stand out without the authors' biases seeping through.

Through conversations with the couples, Das and Yu reveal how each partner perceives their cultural differences, the prejudices of their families, and the political tensions between their countries. Despite these difficulties, these couples ultimately find common ground and build new identities, not just as lovers but as "peacemakers." Their resilience, humour, and genuine affection shine through, making each story compelling and relatable.

The book is structured around a three-stage arc that many crosscultural relationships go through. The first stage casts the couples as rebels, individuals who defy cultural norms and family expectations to pursue their love. This is followed by the second stage, where they face rejection and accusations of betrayal, becoming traitors in the eyes of some of their loved ones. Finally, they evolve into peacemakers, finding ways to reconcile cultural differences and create a shared identity

that bridges both worlds. This arc not only keeps the reader engaged but also serves as a thoughtful commentary on the universal journey of cross-cultural couples.

One particularly striking aspect of Rebels, Traitors, Peacemakers is its exploration of the similarities between Indian and Chinese cultures. Both societies place a high value on familial respect, ambition, fidelity, and loyalty. These shared values often help the couples find common ground, even as they grapple with the external pressures that come with cross-cultural unions. The authors also touch on a common trait between India and China: a certain sense of inferiority on the world stage that drives an almost obsessive ambition in the individuals. This dynamic, they argue, often fuels the resilience needed to make such marriages work.

The catalyst for writing *Rebels*,

Traitors, Peacemakers came from a disturbing incident in Singapore in 2022, where a man spat towards an Indian-Chinese couple, claiming the Chinese woman "should be with him." The authors, who live in Singapore, found this reaction surprising, given that one in five marriages in the city-state is interracial. Such incidents highlight the lingering prejudices that cross-cultural couples face even in seemingly cosmopolitan environments, adding urgency to the authors' goal of promoting empathy and understanding. A heartwarming element of the book is its emphasis on hope and

positivity. Despite the hardships, these couples demonstrate a shared commitment to mutual understanding and a deep desire for cultural exchange. The authors, in particular, discuss their mixed-race child who, they believe, has the potential to bridge the world's two largest cultures. With the ability to speak and understand both Mandarin and Hindi, their child could grow up as a true global citizen, free from the biases and limitations that often divide communities.

Pending MSME Payments Soar to Rs 21,108 Cr Across 90,000 Applications in Samadhan Portal

NEW DELHI: A mounting backlog of payments to micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) has reached Rs 21,108 crore across 90,000 applications, according to recent data from the MSME Samadhaan

The portal, which tracks delayed payments from government entities, reveals state governments as the largest defaulters with pending dues of Rs 3,170 crore, while central public sector undertakings follow with Rs 2,191 crore in outstanding payments. The Micro and Small **Enterprises Facilitation Council** has already converted 40,000 applications, worth Rs 13,199 crore, into formal cases.



This development comes as the government strengthens its efforts to address the persistent challenge of delayed payments in the MSME sector. A senior MSME ministry official, speaking on condition cilities, which is helping tackle



This policy shift, set to take effect on October 1, 2024, will apply to NBFCs based on their audited financials as of March 31, 2024, or thereafter. This measure aligns with the RBI's continued effort to bolster supervision within the broader financial sector.

The PCA framework, initially implemented for private NBFCs in October 2022, is designed to ensure early regulatory intervention for financial institutions facing difficulties, thereby safeguarding their financial health



Extending it to governmentowned NBFCs, such as Power Finance Corporation (PFC), REC, Indian Railway Finance Corporation (IRFC), and IFCI, reflects a broader attempt by the central bank to maintain stability in entities with significant ties to other financial

Government-owned NBFCs play a critical role in the infrastructure finance landscape, often engaging in extensive lending to large-scale projects.

However, their size and systemic interconnectedness make them susceptible to sectoral risks, prompting RBI's ensuring corrective measures are implemented proactively.

In addition to fostering financial stability, this oversight tool enables the RBI to take additional actions as needed, reinforcing accountability across the sector.

According to the RBI's statement, the extension of the PCA framework serves as both a safeguard for NBFCs' financial health and a mechanism to enhance market discipline.

This proactive approach underscores the RBI's commitment to a resilient financial ecosystem and follows a series of regulatory measures introduced over recent years to strengthen the NBFC sector.

As the October 2024 deadline approaches, governmentowned NBFCs will be expected to align with the new framework requirements, ensuring they maintain the robust financial parameters essential for long-term stability.

Years ago, it started with the misuse of ATM chips, which later extended to OTP-based scams resulting in unauthorized fund transfers from bank accounts. Despite these advantages, it is also a reality that AI is merely a tool, and its reliability depends on the credibility of the data it utilizes. Additionally, the type of evaluation and analysis desired by an individual or institution poses a limitation to AI's use. Due to this limitation, AI-generated analyses may at times be unreliable, ineffective, or biased. A few years ago, when a major global online company used AI to screen candidates, it found that none of the selected candidates were female. Investigation revealed that only data from past male hires had been fed into AI, which

Similar limitations exist in the financial sector, where AI uses standardized analyses to determine credit scores, giving a competitive advantage to those already favored by past analyses. 

Economic Pandora's box of distressed Indian MSMEs

Mumbai An economic "Pandora's Box"

is likely to open up in India following the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) Borrowers Association highlighting the condition of MSME borrowers in India, who constitute 90% of entrepreneurs in the country but are facing a "distressing" future.

The National MSME Borrowers Association, in a press conference recently at the Mumbai Press Club, focused on the "failure of the authorities - particularly the RBI, Banks and financial institutions -- to give effect to a notification dated 29-5-2015 under Section 9 of the MSMED Act."

"The MSMED Act and the Notification was enacted taking note of the fact that MSMEs are the backbone of the Indian economy, particularly in generation of employment and creation - and equitable distribution - of wealth," according to a MSMEBA release. "The notification is mandatory. Not a single MSME was left unaffected during the COVID-19 period and many suffered huge losses that hampered their bank loan repayments," said Advocate Mathews J. Nedumpara, who has peen fighting for the rights of the MSMEs and had obtained a Supreme Court judgement (M/s. PRO KNITS versus Board of Directors of Canara Bank) in their favour.

"However, despite the Sureme Court judgement, the MSMEs still face threat of dispossession from their homes and enterprises because of reluctance to give effect to this judgement, and thus benefiting the ARCs and those who do business in buying the assets of MSMEs in stress," he said.



Alleging that ARCs and vested interests "have become billionaires overnight by acquiring the properties of affected MSMEs through crafty means," Nedumpara said that gross failure on the part of the RBI and the Regulator to implement the Notification and even the nationalized banks' board of directors not constituting a Committee in this regard

cannot be an innocent failure. Chartered accountant Manisha Mehta, President, MSME-BA, who is one of the affected MSMEs, described how she ran from pillar to post to get justice. "I founded in 1996 Perfect Infraengineers, that was listed by 2015 on the NSE MSME platform with 300 employees for manufacturing an awardwinning, eco-friendly, energysaving product."

However, problems like bank overcharging interest rate, CO-VID-19 lockdown and moratorium made her seek financial aid under the new ECLGS scheme for MSMEs. Then, on July 20, 2020 her bank claimed that her company was an NPA - rendering it ineligible for aid and has since then frozen all her current accounts, while illegally possess-

ing and attempting to sell her immovable properties under the SARFESAI Act, she claimed.

Mehta said that the MSMEBA would be conducting a nationwide public campaign to highlight the "injustice" caused to MSMEs, the violation of their rights and the need for MSMEs to be informed of their rights while also being vigilant and fighting in unity for this.

"The MSMEs, which today includes the trading and service sectors, involves the lives and livelihoods of millions of Indian families. These small-time entrepreneurs face great difficulty to avail credit facilities even from nationalized banks." "The Government of India -- while keeping in mind that this vital priority sector should not perish but grow robustly - made it mandatory for banks and financial institutions to reach out to MSMEs and extend credit facilities even without

collateral securities." "Likewise, those who purchase goods from MSMEs and fail to pay them on time are mandated to pay interest at three times the bank rate. The monies due to the MSMEs can be recovered as though a public debt through revenue recovery proceedings. Lamenting that "all this is only

on paper," Mehta said the notification dated 29-5-2015 "prohibits the bank from classifying the MSME account as NPA, and also initiating recovery steps without constituting a committee."

Noting that not a single bank or financial institution -- including the SBI - has ever constituted a committee or made any attempt towards resolution of the stress, she said that for the last 10 years, "recovery action is being initiated by throwing the notification into the bin."

"Thousands of MSMEs were brought to total ruin with forceful possession being taken of their establishments, factories and homes, and when they knock on the doors of courts - the NCLT. DRT, High Court and Supreme Court - relief is declined for reasons difficult to fathom." The MSMEBA stated that

though India has the largest workforce in the world with about 80 crores people aged between 20 to 60, majority of them are unemployed or underemployed - where India faces the largest problem of unemployment – and highlights the

need for building a +robust+

MSME sector. The Ministry of Micro, Small

and Medium Enterprises, Government of India, vide their Gazette Notification dated May 29, 2015, had notified a "Framework for Revival and Rehabilitation of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, to provide a simpler and faster mechanism to address the stress in the accounts of MSMEs and to facilitate the promotion and development of MSMEs.

The Reserve Bank was advised to issue necessary instructions to banks for effective implementation and monitoring of this Framework

After carrying out certain changes in the captioned Framework in consultation with the Indian Government, Ministry of MSME, so as to make it compatible with the existing regulatory guidelines on 'Income Recognition, Asset Classification and provisioning pertaining to Advances' issued to banks by RBI, the guidelines on the captioned Framework along with operating instructions were issued to banks on March 17, 2016.

The Revival and rehabilitation of MSME units having loan limits upto Rs 25 crore would be undertaken under this Framework. Banks were required to put into place their own Boardapproved policy to operationalize the Framework not later than June 30, 2016.

The revised Framework superseded earlier guidelines on Rehabilitation of Sick Micro and Small Enterprises issued vide circular RPCD. CO> MSME & NFS.BC.40/06.02.31/2012-2013 date November 1, 2012, except those relating to Reliefs and Concessions for Rehabilitation of Potentially Viable Units and One Time Settlement, mentioned in the said circular.
