# IMA Haryana decides to suspend treatment in private hospitals under Ayushman Bharat due to outstanding of Rs 400 crore

The Indian Medical Association (IMA), representing nearly 600 private hospitals empanelled under the Ayushman Bharat scheme (PMJAY) in Haryana, has warned of suspending treatment services under the scheme from February 3, 2025 if their dues worth Rs 400 crore are not cleared. As per the reports, there are around 1300 hospitals eligible for the Ayushman Bharat scheme of which 600 are private facilities. The Ayushman Bharat scheme launched by the BJP government in 2018 aims to provide free access to health insurance coverage for low-income earners and of age

above 70 in the country.

On Sunday, 26th January, the Indian Medical Association (IMA) in Haryana stated that around 600 private hospitals in the state have decided to stop treating pa-tients under the Ayushman Bharat scheme from February 3rd, 2025 since the private hospitals have Rs 400 crore pending dues from the government under Avushman Bharat The IMA's Haryana unit said that the patients at the private hospital relying on the slated government health

treat the patients at their cost under the slated scheme and from the scheme as the doctors would not treat them under the said scheme. The IMA's Haryana unit said that this is because the government has not yet cleared the reimbursement of the hospitals worth Rs 400 crores.

As per the reports, there are around 1300 hospitals eligible for the Ayushman Bharat scheme of which nearly 600 are private facilities. The Ayushman Bharat scheme launched by the BJP government in 2018 aims to provide free access to health insurance coverage for low-income earners as well as to those of age above 70 as per revised scheme in the country. In the state of Haryana, there are over 1.2 crore people who are registered under the scheme. The association opined that the private hospitals were not able to manage their expenses while treating the patients under the Ayushman Bharat scheme, given no reimbursement from the government.

Dr Mahavir Jain, president of IMA (Haryana) commented on the matter and said that the speed of reimbursement from the government is very sluggish. He demanded that the payment of the hospitals should be released immediately as it is exceedingly dif-Dhirender K Soni said.

#### Punjab: Arrest of six gangsters averts possible target killing

Counter Intelligence (CI), Amritsar has foiled a possible target killing plan with the arrest of six members of Kaushal Chaudhary gang, including two key shooters identified as Puneet Lakhanpal and Narinder Kumar alias

Both were involved in the murders of Kabaddi player Sandeep Singh Nangal Ambian and Sukhmeet Singh alias Deputy, said Director General of Police (DGP) Puniab. Gaurav Yadav here on Monday, January 27, 2024.

The other four arrested gangsters have been identified as Harpreet Singh alias Happal of Guru Har Sahai in Ferozepur, Gurbhinder Singh of Chattiwind Lehal in Amritsar, Sandeep Singh of Village Rajdhan in Amritsar and Maninderjit Singh alias Shinda of Badowal Jhande in

Punjab Police teams have also recovered six .30 bore foreign-made pistols along with 40 rounds from their possession.

This gang was also involved in the incident of indiscriminate firing at Highway King Hotel in Rajasthan and an extortion demand of Rs 5 crore in September 2024. All the arrested accused persons have a criminal history and they had been evading arrests for the last three years, he added.

Preliminary investigation has revealed that the arrested persons are professional shooters of the organised criminal network of Kaushal Chaudhary gang, which is active in Harvana, Rajasthan, Punjab, etc. They execute criminal activities on the directions of their foreign-

based handlers. On Sunday, a team of CI Amritsar received a reliable input about members of the gang including Amarjit Singh alias Amar, Jagjit Singh alias Gandhi, Balwinder Singh alias Doni, Prabhdeep Singh alias Prabh Dasuwal, and others, were planning a target killing in the state from abroad with the assistance of local operatives.

It was learnt that the local members of the gang, equipped with lethal weapons, were reportedly roaming near Haveli restaurant in Jandiala Amritsar. Acting swiftly on the input, police teams laid a special checkpoint and arrested six gangsters. Six pistols and ammunition were recovered from their possession.

Further investigation is on to uncover deeper links within their criminal network, which spans multiple states and involves illegal activities including extortion, arms smuggling, and organised violence.

### Govt must work for adequate MGNREGS funds

he success of any welfare

program is intricately tied to

the commitment of the gov-

ernment overseeing it. As the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGN-REGS) nears two decades of operation, its longevity under successive governments underscores its necessity and impact. Initially perceived as an obligation rather than a priority under the National Democratic Alliance (NDA), the scheme's significance became evident during the COVID-19 pandemic, when it provided crucial sustenance to both rural workers and returning migrant laborers. However, recent budgetary allocations suggest an apparent neglect of MGNREGS, with its share in total budgetary expenditure declining from 3.2 per cent in FY21 to 1.78 per cent in FY25. Despite being a demand-driven program, where expenditure typically exceeds initial allocations, no additional funds have been sanctioned this financial year. This has led to delayed wages and suppressed demand, with reports indicating a shortfall of Rs 4,315 crore for wages and an additional Rs 5,715 crore pending for material costs. Further, the implementation hurdles such as Aadhaar-based payment bottlenecks and inflation-adjusted wage inadequacies remain unresolved. The scheme's essence lies in providing guaranteed employment—a promise that is undermined when funds are artificially restricted. MGNREGS is not merely an income support mechanism; it contributes to village infrastructure, irrigation canals, rural roads, and water conservation projects. By increasing rural disposable income, it also strengthens the local economy. Given that rural poverty remains a pressing challenge, the Union government must rethink its approach. A realistic budgetary allocation, aligned with actual demand, is imperative to maintain the scheme's integrity. Ensuring timely disbursement of wages and adequate funding is not just an economic necessity but a moral obligation towards India's rural workforce. A proactive approach by the government will take the country forward.

e 2023-24 Household Consumption Expenditure Survey (HCES) factsheet, released by the government, has reignited debates surrounding poverty estimation in India. The findings, which suggest a decline in poverty across both urban and rural areas, have sparked discussions on the methodologies, definitions, and reliability of the data. Let's delve into the changing definition of

India's definition of poverty has evolved significantly over the decades. From the late 1970s to 2005, poverty was primarily measured based on the expenditure required to sustain a minimum calorie intake. This method was periodically updated every five years using data from the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO). However, as the NSSO's estimates of private expenditure began to diverge from the figures provided by the National Accounts, questions arose about the accuracy and consistency of these measurements.

In response, the Tendulkar Committee introduced new benchmarks, shifting the focus from calorie intake to broader consumption patterns. Later, methodologies such as the Mixed Reference Period (MRP) and Modified Mixed Reference Period (MMRP) were adopted to improve recall accuracy in expenditure surveys. While these changes enhanced data quality, they also introduced challenges in comparing data across time periods. Moreover, the absence of official poverty estimates after 2011-12 and reliance on alternative datasets and multidimensional poverty indices have further complicated the poverty narrative.

#### Has poverty declined?

India has witnessed a substantial reduction in poverty over the last two decades, regardless of the methodology used. High GDP growth, targeted welfare programmes, and improved public delivery systems have contributed to this decline. Schemes such as the National Food Security Act, which covers nearly 800 million people, have played a significant role in alleviating extreme poverty. Estimates suggest that poverty rates have dropped to single digits, with recent data indicating a decline of over 17 per cent between survey rounds

However, the credibility of these estimates depends on the poverty line and data quality. For instance, using a higher expenditure estimate based on revised methodologies and applying it to older poverty lines naturally lowers poverty rates. Critics argue that these adjustments could underestimate the actual extent of deprivation.

One major concern with the HCES data is the divergence between NSSO per capita household consumption expenditure and National Accounts estimates. Changes in recall periods and survey methodologies have made it difficult to compare data across time. The recent shift to collecting data in three sittings has improved accuracy but has also inflated expenditure estimates. Without revising poverty lines to reflect these changes, poverty may appear lower than it is.

Another issue lies in the composition of the consumption basket. Food items now constitute less than 50 per cent of total household expenditure, indicating a shift towards services and other essentials. This evolving consumption pattern necessitates a re-examination of the methodology used to define poverty.

The gap between rural and urban consumption is narrowing, reflecting improvements in rural living standards. However, these changes may be overstated due to outdated definitions of rural and urban areas based on the 2011 Census. Many peri-urban regions, classified as rural, exhibit consumption patterns similar to urban areas. A revised classification could reveal faster declines in urban poverty.

#### Revising the poverty line

The debate over poverty estimation also centres on the adequacy of existing poverty lines. The Rangarajan methodology, applied to the latest HCES data, estimates poverty at 25 per cent, significantly higher than other estimates. The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), using a \$2.15/day poverty line, estimated India's poverty rate at 12.9 per cent in 2019. These disparities highlight

the need for a unified methodology. While revising the poverty line is crucial, it must be supported by consistent application and government endorsement. Without a stable benchmark, poverty estimation risks becoming an exercise in statistical interpretation rather than a tool for policymaking. India's multidimensional poverty index (MPI) has added depth to poverty measurement by incorporating indicators such as bank accounts and maternal health. However, some criticisms remain valid. Certain indicators, such as childrelated metrics, may not apply to all households, skewing results. Additionally, once households gain access to amenities like electricity or bank accounts, they rarely lose them, causing MPI-based poverty estimates to remain perpetually low.

A more robust approach would include measures of income vulnerability and dynamic deprivation, capturing the fluidity of poverty over time.

India's journey in poverty reduction is commendable, but questions about the accuracy of estimates and the adequacy of methodologies persist. The divergence between data sets, evolving consumption patterns, and the complexity of ruralurban classifications necessitate a re-evaluation of how poverty is defined and measured.

Poverty is more than just a statistical figure; it reflects the lived experiences of millions. To address it effectively, India must adopt a transparent, comprehensive, and unified methodology that aligns with current realities. Strengthening data collection, revising poverty lines, and incorporating dynamic measures of deprivation can ensure that poverty estimates guide meaningful

policy interventions. Above all, reducing poverty requires sustained efforts to boost incomes, improve public delivery systems, and address structural inequalities.

Furthermore, the integration of technological advancements in data collection and analysis can enhance the accuracy of poverty assessments. Utilizing tools such as machine learning and remote sensing can provide real-time insights into poverty dynamics, allowing for more responsive and effective policy interventions. For instance, recent studies have explored the use of deep learning to estimate living conditions in India, achieving promising results across various outcomes.

Additionally, fostering collaboration between governmental agencies, academic institutions, and international organizations can lead to the development of more holistic poverty measurement frameworks. Such partnerships can facilitate the sharing of best practices, the harmonization of methodologies, and the creation of comprehensive data systems that capture the multifaceted nature of poverty. For instance, the collaboration between policymakers and academics in Indonesia has een instrumental in designing effective policies and programs to combat poverty.

Moreover, integrating qualitative insights from those experiencing poverty can enrich quantitative data, leading to more nuanced and effective interventions. Participatory approaches, where the voices of the poor are included in the analysis, have been shown to provide valuable perspectives that traditional metrics might overlook. This inclusive strategy ensures that policies are grounded in the lived realities of individuals, thereby enhancing their relevance and impact.

To sum it up, while India's progress in reducing poverty is commendable, it is imperative to continually refine our measurement tools and methodologies. By embracing collaborative, multidimensional, and participatory approaches, we can develop a more accurate and comprehensive understanding of poverty. This, in turn, will inform policies that are more targeted and effective, ultimately leading to sustainable poverty alleviation and improved quality of life for all citizens.

# Maharashtra's election mystery: Real voters or ghosts?



ne executive Government is instructing or managing things in such a manner that those people who do not belong to them either racially, culturally or linguistically, are being excluded from being brought on the electoral rolls. Electoral rolls are a most fundamental thing in a democracy... Independence of elections and avoidance of any interference by the executive should be regarded as a fundamental right," said Dr. B.R. Ambedkar in June 1949 in the Constituent Assembly while introducing the Constitutional provision to set up the Election Commission of India (ECI). All of India's founding leaders agreed with is the 75th anniversary of the birth of the ECI — also celebrated as National Voters Day (January 25). Sadly, India's founding leaders will feel let-down by the ECI and not deem it to be a happy 75th birthday.

Dr. Ambedkar was prescient in his warnings about electoral roll manipulation by the executive. While he was more concerned about exclusion of voters through identity discrimination, government interference in electoral rolls can also be through a process of mass inclusion of voters to tilt an election as seen in the recently held Maharashtra State elections

The ECI enrolled 9.7 crore voters for the 2024 Maharashtra State election. The Narendra Modi government's Ministry of Health report estimated the entire adult population of Maharashtra (18-plus years),

in 2024, as 9.54 crore. The ECI, by its own admission, registered 16 lakh more voters than the official estimate of the total adult the government's estimate is only a projection, and can vary, it still implies that nearly 100% or more of all the adults in Maharashtra were registered as voters for the State election. This is very strange because the ECI neither enrolled nearly all adults as voters for the Maharashtra Lok Sabha election held just six months earlier, nor ever before in any of the other large States. Then, how were more people than the entire estimated adult population of Maharashtra enrolled as voters only for the State election?

#### Mass enrolment in just months

This is because 48 lakh people were registered as new voters in just six months between the Lok Sabha and the State elections. For context, between 2019 to 2024, only 32 lakh new voters were enrolled. In other

words, 50% more people were enrolled as voters in just six months vis-à-vis the previous five-year period. What led to this sudden, and intriguing, rush by Maharashtrians to register and vote in the State election alone?

Clues emerge upon careful analysis of the outcome. The BJP-led Mahayuti alliance gained 72 lakh more votes in the State election compared to the Lok Sabha election. One would logically presume that this gain by the BJP alliance was largely due to voters that voted for the Congress-led Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance in the Lok Sabha election who then shifted allegiance to the BJP alliance for the state election. But that is not the case. Only 24 lakh such voters moved away elections. So, where did the BJP alliance get its remaining 48 lakh (72 lakh - 24 lakh) votes from for the State election?

What explains the sudden rush of new voters in six months for the State election? Are they real voters? Or are they ghosts? Were their documents verified when they were enrolled as voters? How is it that all the new voters enrolled seem to have voted for just one alliance?

Regardless of one's political affiliations, to a rational mind, it is amply evident that there is something amiss with the electoral rolls in the Maharashtra election. Perhaps, there are sincere answers to these questions. If so, is it not logical to expect the ECI to release all the data in the public domain and issue clarifications in a transparent manner? But the ECI is conspicuously silent and arrogantly dismissive of these questions. A

Election Commissioner, is that if there was such a large-scale addition of dubious or ghost voters, why were the Opposition parties with their war-rooms, not alert enough to catch this in time? This is a duplicitous way to absolve the ECI using the line of a political party's organisational inefficiencies.

It is unfair and illegal to add vast numbers of dubious voters to influence an election and its outcome. It is the ECI's constitutional responsibility to run a fair election. This is why India's founding leaders entrusted an independent ECI with the responsibility of preserving India's electoral sanctity and not to be reliant on political parties.

Of course, not even a single eligible citizen should be denied his vote, and an appropriate backup process can be evolved for those whose biometric verifications fail. Aadhaar verification of electoral rolls and voting is the birthday cake that the ECI must be given to preserve and strengthen India's electoral democracy. It is an idea that even Dr. Ambedkar and other founding leaders may approve of.





This will also give strength to the digitalization campaign of the country, they will also be able to get facilities like crop insurance, agricultural loan etc. There has been a significant reduction in the nonperforming assets (NPAs) of

banks in the past years. However, recovery mechanisms like SARFAESI, Bank Adalat etc. need to be strengthened further. In contrast, the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) was established under the Companies Act, 2013 to recover NPAs from large defaulting companies, but its performance has also not been as expected. The excessive delay in reaching a decision and the settlement amount being 15 to 25 percent of the principal loan amount raises questions on its success.

Following the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, TDS (Tax Deducted at Source) on benefits given to bank employees is going to be introduced from January 2025. Some banks have currently

borne this burden themselves, while some have not. I think the government needs to intervene in the matter. This loss can be compensat-

ed by increasing the number of incomes taxpayers or the bank employees can be given options like performancebased bonus or compensation which is tax exempt or increasing the cash component of the salary in place of this loss. It is believed that this provision may negatively affect the performance of bank employees, because they work in a stressful environment. The reduction in benefits may reduce their morale and the profit of banks may decrease, which may also have a partial negative impact on the country's economy.

It can be said that the performance of the banking sector has improved in the recent years and a significant reduction in NPA has also been recorded. However, at present, the bank is facing a crisis of deposits. After banking facilities have become digital, the incidents of online fraud have increased a lot, due to which the trust of investors in banks has decreased. The expected reduction in NPA has also not happened due to the weakness of the recovery mechanism of banks. On the other hand, the deduction of TDS on the benefits given to bank employees has led to a reduction in their morale, which has increased the possibility of a negative impact on the performance of the bank. Therefore, provisions to solve these problems need to be made in the budget.

# House Foreign Affairs Committee to review America's policy towards India

WASHINGTON: The powerful House Committee on Foreign Affairs will review the US policy towards India and the continued expansion of bilateral cooperation, particularly in the defence sector.

India appears on the 11th list of priorities for the House Committee on Foreign Affairs for the current Congress.

The committee said it "will review US policy towards India and the continued expansion of bilateral cooperation rooted in shared democratic values while countering the influence of US adversaries in South and Central Asia.'

"Particular attention will be paid to the US-India defence relationship, including security and technology cooperation, opportunities for expanded roles, missions, and capabilities, and counterterrorism efforts," it said.

The committee will also focus on efforts to effectively enhance US-India economic



"The committee will also focus on efforts to bolster India's participation in the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue efforts and review the implications of India's rapidly growing energy demands," it said.

ceutical industries.

The top priority for the committee will be the dangers posed by China.

Organisation and other trade and investment obligations, non-proliferation regimes, cyber agreements, and other bilateral and international agreements.

After China, the second on top of the priority is an examination of the State Department's participation in multilateral forums such as the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework and Quadrilateral Security Dialogue and closely monitor any discussion of trade agreements in the Indo-Pacific region.

It will also conduct regular review and oversight over the State Department and US Agency for International Development resourcing in the Indo-Pacific.

Among the top 10 issues for the committee are Taiwan, Europe, Russia and its war against Ukraine, the Middle East and North Africa, Israel, Iran, Africa and Afghanistan.

**Quran burner Salwan Momika Shot Dead in** Sweden, 5 arrested



mika, the 38-year-man who held several demonstrations in Sweden and was accused of burning the Quran, has been shot dead in the city of Sodertalje in Stockholm County in east central Sweden, Swedish media reported on Thursday.

Momika was allegedly shot dead while he was conducting a live broadcast on social media from his apartment in Hovsjo late on Wednesday, a day before a verdict was scheduled to be announced by the Stockholm District Court in an incitement case against him.

"I can confirm that five people have been arrested, suspected of murder," prosecutor Rasmus Ohman was quoted as saying by Sweden's leading daily Dagens Nyheter. According to the spokesper-

son for the Stockholm Police Region, the police received a report of the shooting in Hovsjo at 11:11 pm, local time.

The newspaper detailed that the crime scene was investigated overnight and the apartment building remains cordoned off on Thursday with several police officers on site. It was reported that drones have also been sent up over the area.

The police have been questioning me and they confirmed that he has died," Salwan Najem, a friend of Salwan Momika, told Swedish state broadcaster SVT. Najem, who said that he has been told "you're next", had also spoken during the night with Momika's girlfriend.

## **United Nations chief speaks** with presidents of Rwanda, DR Congo over conflict



UNITED NATIONS: UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres talked over the phone with the presidents of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and Rwanda to discuss the escalating conflict in the DRC, a UN spokesman said. When asked about the content

of the conversations, Stephane Dujarric, chief spokesman for the UN secretary-general, replied at a regular briefing, "The secretarygeneral obviously discussed the situation in the DRC, and he's been very clear both publicly and privately for the need for Rwanda to cease support to the M23 (March 23 Movement) and withdraw from the DRC."

The M23 rebels occupy portions of Goma, the largest city of eastern DRC, while Rwanda has been denying allegations its troops were in the DRC, supporting M23, Xinhua news agency reported. The spokesman added that during the call with Rwandan President Paul Kagame, Guterres emphasised the need to protect civilians in the DRC's fighting. In a statement released on Sunday, the UN chief said that he was deeply concerned by the escalating violence in the eastern DRC, and reiterated his strongest condemnation of the M23's ongoing offensive and advances toward Goma. He called on the M23 to immediately cease all hostile actions and withdraw from occupied areas.

Dujarric also said at the briefing the situation in Goma remains tense and fluid. "M23 forces, we are told, are inside

the city, and UN peacekeeping personnel and troops have largely been forced to shelter in their bases, " he told reporters. "Medical facilities in Goma are reportedly overwhelmed, and essential services have obviously been disrupted." The

spokesman said the M23 controls the airport, and armed clashes continue in multiple regions, including in Masisi, Rutshuru, and Nyiragongo, further displacing civilians. He said there were risks of a breakdown in law and order in the city, given the proliferation of weapons. The UN mission in the DRC, known as MONUSCO, said it has seen credible reports of escapees from the prison in Goma, as well as looting by civilians. The movement of essential sup-

plies and personnel is an urgent concern as hostilities complicate humanitarian efforts, Dujarric said. Non-essential UN personnel have been temporarily relocated from the south Kivu province capital city and the surrounding area. "Our peacekeeping colleagues also report that protests in Kinshasa over the ongoing situation in the DRC have turned violent, with demonstrators setting fire outside of UN premises -- both the peacekeeping and some of our agencies -- as well as targeting several embassies, "the spokesman said. "Looting has also been reported in Kinshasa." The Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) said the humanitarian situation in and around Goma remains worrying. t was in 1975 (or perhaps the first half of 1976) that I first set eyes on Saif Ali Khan. He was fast asleep on the upper berth of a coupe on a Mumbai-Ahmedabad train. The berth was booked in the name of his father, the Nawab of Pataudi, Mansoor Ali Khan, a former captain of India's cricket

The Nawab and I had dinner on the lower berth, which was booked in my name. Ten years later, he came to my Chandigarh bungalow to interview me. He recalled our train journey and I inquired about his son.

A few years ago, I met Saif and his wife, Kareena, at the Mahalaxmi Race Course. It was the day of the Indian Derby. Saif and I were guests of our mutual friend, Farouq Rattonsey, whose horses had won the race in two successive years previously. I took advantage of the occasion to recount to him that train journey.

Earlier this month, I found his name and pictures splashed across newspapers and news channels for his brush with an intruder in his 11th-floor residence in Mumbai's tony suburb of Bandra, where many Bollywood actors live. Saif was stabbed when he confronted the intruder. He had to go to a private, wellknown hospital close to his home for medical treatment, including a surgery in close proximity to the spine. It was a delicate operation expertly performed by the hospital's competent doctors. Saif recovered in five days and was discharged.

An unnecessary controversy was kicked up in the electronic and print media on unrelated issues like why his wife did not accompany him to the hospital and why he chose an autorickshaw over an Uber or an Ola. (Answer: It was easily available outside his residence).

The worst was yet to come. In the days following the assault, critics of the Maharashtra Government went to town proclaim-



ing a total collapse of law and order. They denigrated my city of Mumbai as the most dangerous place to live in and its police force as the pits as far as security of life and property was concerned. Arnab Goswami, the doyen of sensation-seeking newshounds, found fault with every move the police made to nab the culprit. He was still smarting from the fact that the Mumbai Police had

Infiltration of Bangladeshis into India has taken root ever since the Pakistan Army unleashed its depredations there in 1971. Infiltration continued thereafter for economic reasons. It tapered off when Bangladesh's economy improved and took off again when the agitation against the Sheikh Hasina government gathered steam. To give other slants to immigration except the obvious economic one are games that politicians play. Infiltrators should be rounded up and sent back. The Mumbai Police have been doing this from the days I was its Police Commissioner and that is a good 40 years ago

We have had enough of politics and amateur sleuthing in the Saif case. His Afghan ancestors had helped the East India Company win the war against the Marathas. In gratitude, the company bestowed on the Barech tribe of Pashtuns, led by Faiz Talab Khan, an ancestor of Saif, the princely state of Pataudi with 40 villages thrown in. Saif is the titular Nawab today, even though the intruder was unaware of his identity. He chose Saif's flat because the actor had carelessly kept the bathroom window open.

### Amritsar man gets new lease of life post complex Whipple surgery

Vikramjit Singh (50) a patient from Amritsar, who was suffering from deep jaundice and a tumour in stomach and small intestine, got a new lease of life after a successful complex Whipple surgery at Max Hospital, Mohali.

Giving information, Dr Manmohan Bedi, associate director general surgery said that Vikramjit was brought to Max in a critically deteriorating condition. He was suffering from yellowish discoloration of his eyes. He was diagnosed with deep jaundice which led to further evaluation of the patient and disclosed a tumour in the duodenum (small intestine). The biopsy was taken from the tumour to determine its nature. The patient's condition continued to deteriorate further as he started to pass blood through motion thus causing a dangerous fall in his blood pressure level due to continuous bleeding from the affected intestine. All efforts to stop the bleeding failed despite repeated endoscopy and efforts through interventional radiology. Furthermore, hishaemoglobin dropped down to 3 grams despite transfusing 20 units of blood. The drugs to maintain the blood pressure too failed to maintain the level.


Dr Bedi said, "The surgery was extremely challenging and complex. It required the removal of the bleeding part of the intestine, along with a major portion of the head of the pancreas, the lower end of the common bile duct, and part of the stomach, to control the bleeding." Given the poor health condition of the patient, which was deteriorating with time, the surgical option was opted for by the patient by understanding the high complications of the case. "The major challenge in this highly complex surgery was the patient's critical condition and administering anaesthesia to maintain stability during the procedure, ensuring the removal of the affected organs with minimal blood loss,


